Introduction: The Wayne County Board of Education requests approval of an amendment to their current 2020-2030 Comprehensive Educational Facilities Plan (CEFP).

Changes: Policy 6200 requires all local boards of education to submit amendments to CEFPs to the West Virginia Board of Education and the School Building Authority of West Virginia (SBA) for approval. The Wayne County Board of Education requests approval to amend its CEFP to add and make a top priority safe school entries at East Lynn Elementary School, Lavalette Elementary School, Dunlow Elementary School, and Genoa Elementary School. The project is planned to be funded through local funds and a grant from the SBA.

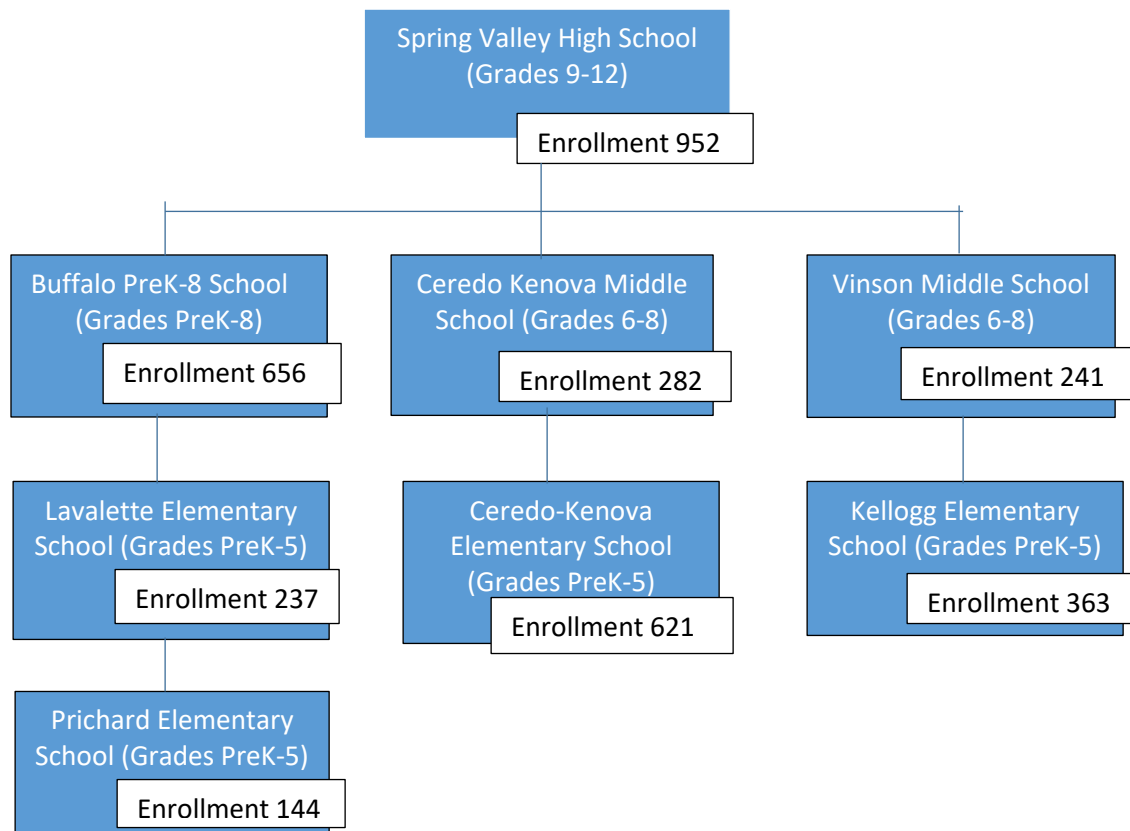

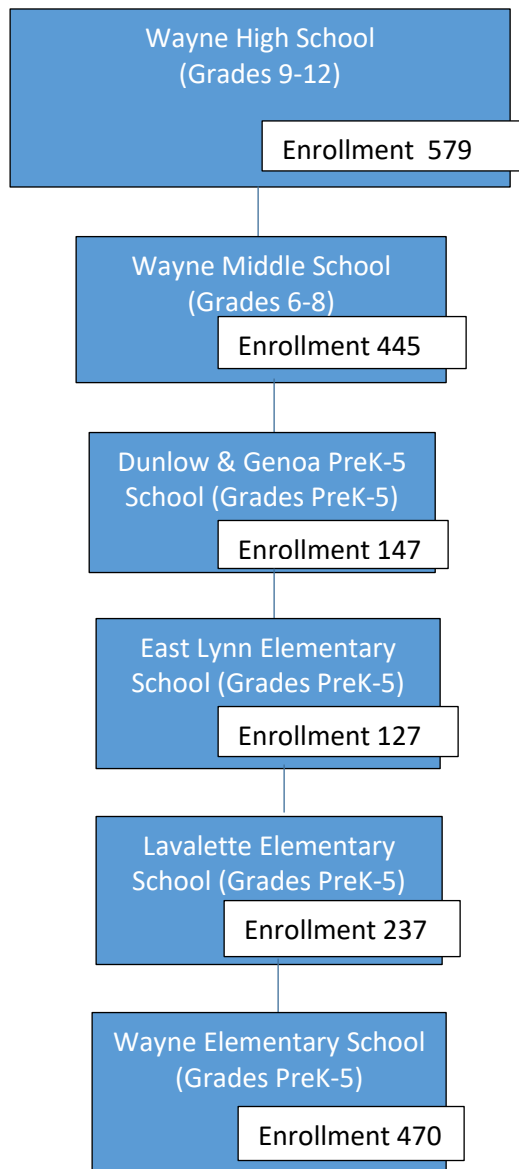

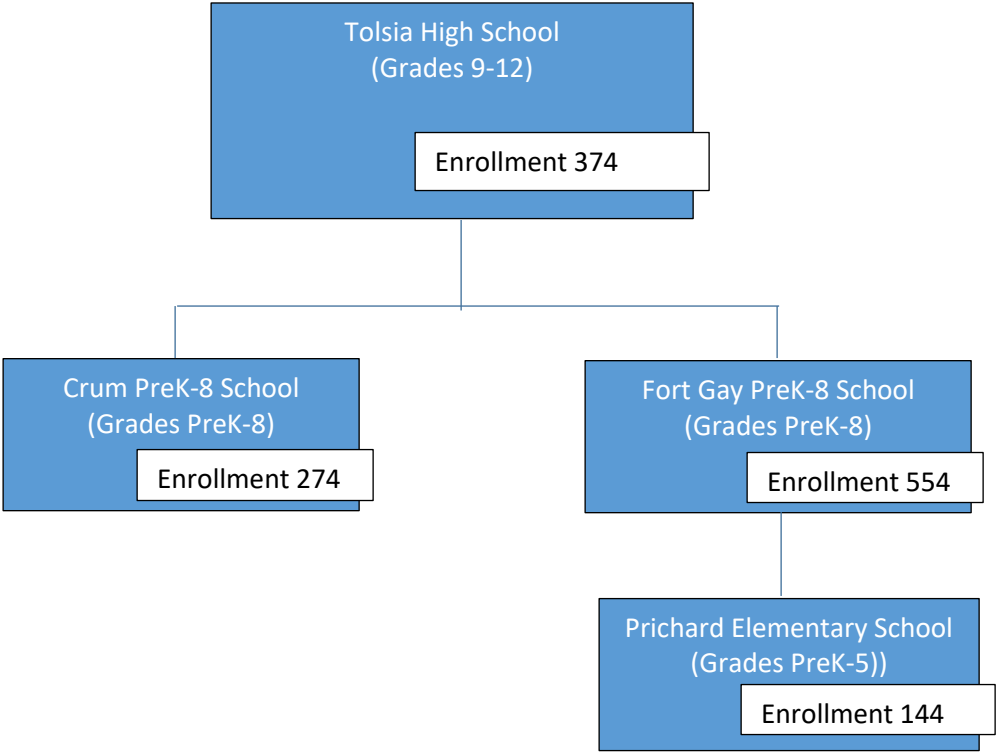
