WVBE Policy 2330 outlines the process for recognition of nonpublic schools in West Virginia as being accredited. Currently, the WVDE maintains a list of five organizations approved by the WVBE. Three additional organizations have

submitted proposals aligned with WVBE Policy 2330 for approval. These organizations include Christian Schools International (CSI), North American Christian School Accrediting Agency (NACSAA), and Society for Classical Learning (SCL). All three proposals have been reviewed and recommended by the Nonpublic School Coalition, comprised of nonpublic school administrators who are fully accredited by one of the five approved accrediting organizations. If the WVBE approves these additional agencies, nonpublic schools that meet accreditation requirements within these organizations will be recognized as accredited in West Virginia.

It is recommended that the **Christian Schools International (CSI), North American Christian School Accrediting Agency (NACSAA), and Society for Classical Learning be approved as nonpublic school accreditation organizations that meet the requirements of WVBE Policy 2330.**

4. Monongalia County Schools' Request for a Waiver of WVBE Policy 4321.1, Standards for School Nutrition – (Action)

8. Appointment to the Alternative Certification Educator Preparation Program Review Board (ACEPPRB) – (Action)

The ACEPPRB makes recommendations to the WVBE regarding the approval of initial and continuing alternative certification programs for the education of teachers. These programs make it possible for qualified individuals to earn a teacher certification that helps fill staff vacancies in areas of critical need and shortage. According to WVBE Policy 5901, the ACEPPRB is comprised of nine members who may serve up to two consecutive three-year terms and are appointed as follows: Two members representing higher education; three members (one who was alternatively prepared) representing public education, one member at each programmatic level for elementary, middle, and high school; two members representing county offices; one member who is a principal appointed by the State Superintendent of Schools; and one member from the West Virginia Commission for Professional Teaching Standards. The current vacancies are for one county office representative and one high school educator, to be appointed by the WVBE. The recommended appointees are Tonji Bowen, Coordinator of Curriculum and Intervention for Wayne County Schools, and Melissa Ennis, a high school teacher for Kanawha County Schools who was alternatively prepared to acquire her teacher certification.

It is recommended **that the appointment of Tonji Bowen and Melissa Ennis to serve on the ACEPPRB be approved.**

9. West Virginia Licensure Testing Directory Approval – (Action)

10. Statewide Waiver of WVBE Policy 2510, Assuring the Quality of Education: Regulations for Education Programs, Section 5.1 – (Action)

The Hancock County Board of Education requests approval to revise its CEFP to include an HVAC replacement at Oak Glen High School and Weir Middle School, Pyrite Remediation at Oak Glen Middle School, district-wide fire alarm and elevator upgrades, and other miscellaneous upgrades. Hancock County Schools plans to fund this project through a combination of local funds and an SBA grant request.

It is recommended that **Hancock County's amendment to its 2020-2030 CEFP be approved.**

**12. West Virginia Wesleyan College's (WVWC) Request for a Waiver of WVBE Policy 5100, Appendix A – (Action)

West Virginia Wesleyan College's School of Education requests approval of a waiver of WVBE Policy 5100, Appendix A, which requires alignment of School Counselor Preparation Programs with the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Education Programs standards. Instead, WVWC proposes to align its program with the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) standards to incorporate the school counseling program into its existing CAEP-accredited system, supporting cohesive cyclical review and continuous improvement processes.

It is recommended that **WVWC's waiver request of WVBE Policy 5100, Appendix A, be approved.**

**13. Approval of 2026 Summer School Programs – (Action)

WVBE Policy 2510, Assuring the Quality of Education: Regulations for Education Programs, provides in pertinent part, *"Schools may award credits earned from approved summer schools provided the instructional program is equivalent to that required during the regular school term. All county summer school programs shall be submitted to the WVBE for approval by June 1 of each year."*

It is recommended that the **2026 summer school programs, as included in Attachment K, be approved.**

14. Statewide Waiver of WVBE Policy 2525, Section 5.1.b. relating to pre-K eligibility and enrollment – (Action)

Due to multiple requests, it is recommended that a statewide waiver of WVBE Policy 2525, Section 5.1.b., be approved to allow parents and/or guardians to choose to enroll their child in pre-K at five years old instead of starting kindergarten if the child has not attended a public pre-K previously.

Most secondary public schools and several private schools in West Virginia belong to the WVSSAC. Each year, the principals of member schools submit revisions to the rules and regulations. The submitted proposals are presented and voted upon at the annual Board of Control meeting. Any approved changes are then submitted to the WVBE for review and approval pursuant to *W. Va. Code §18-2-25(b)*. The proposed changes to this rule are a result of the passage of House Bill No. 4425 - *To repeal the provision allowing for students to transfer from one school to another without losing eligibility* (2026 Regular Legislative Session), effective on June 11, 2026. The WVSSAC Board of Control approved this rule revision on March 31, 2026, and it should be filed as an emergency rule on June 11, 2026, to avoid conflicts with current law.

It is recommended that **WVSSAC, Series 2, be approved as an emergency rule, effective upon filing on June 11, 2026, and be placed on public comment for 30 days from filing.**

**F. West Virginia Schools for the Deaf and the Blind (WVSDB) Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Hampshire County Little League (HCLL) – (Action)

Since 1949, the HCLL has been utilizing property owned by the WVBE on behalf of the WVSDB for baseball activities. In 2013, HCLL approached the WVBE seeking to install light towers on the property. As a result, the WVBE decided to enter into a MOU with HCLL. An MOU was approved by the WVBE in March 2014, providing permission for the League to install the light towers and to have the use of the fields indefinitely, while requiring the League to carry liability insurance and indemnify the WVBE. Under the MOU, the WVBE retains the right to terminate the arrangement upon 30 days' written notice, but if it does so, the WVBE is required to compensate HCLL for the fair market value of its improvements to the property.

In April 2026, HCLL contacted WVSDB Superintendent Clayton Burch seeking permission to construct an Indoor Training Facility on the same tract of land. According to materials provided by the League, the Indoor Training Facility is planned to be 40' in width, 80' in length, and 14' in height, containing two multi-use lanes for indoor baseball practices and pregame warmups. The total cost of the facility is expected to be \$70,850 and will be financed by the HCLL through donations.

As a result, an Addendum to the MOU is proposed, which will set forth the WVBE's permission for the HCLL to construct the Indoor Training Facility and to otherwise update some aspects of the MOU. The WVBE will continue to retain the right to terminate the MOU upon 30 days' written notice and, if it does so, it will be required to compensate the League for the fair market value of the League's improvements to the property.

It is recommended that the **Addendum to the MOU with HCLL be approved.**
