Whereas, JROTC cadets and units receive awards that recognize their loyalty, academic excellence, physical fitness, and citizenship among many other things; and

Whereas, we recognize the dedicated retired military personnel who share their wealth of experience and knowledge with these young men and women; and

Whereas, in West Virginia we recognize the value and importance of the JRTOC in assisting young people to become leaders and good citizens.


Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim February 2018 as:
