- 3. Logan County Schools requests a waiver of Policy 4336 for creating bus routes that will exceed the recommended duration of transportation time for elementary students - (Action)**

Due to the emergency closure of Verdunville Elementary School, the Logan County Board of Education requests a waiver of Policy 4336, School Closings and Consolidations, to create bus routes that will exceed the recommended duration of transportation time for elementary students. This waiver is for the 2025-2026 school year and will only apply to new routes that exceed the recommended limit of forty-five minutes but below the maximum allowable sixty minutes. Long-term waivers may be considered as part of the full school closure procedure outlined in Policy 6204.

It is recommended that the **request for an emergency waiver of Policy 4336 for Logan County Schools** be approved.

4. Statewide waiver request of Policy 4336 for transporting students to alternative education sites.

A statewide waiver of Policy 4336 is requested to allow counties staffing flexibility when transporting students to alternative education sites. For the purposes of this waiver, the term “alternate educational site” encompasses a variety of educational placements based on student circumstances, including, but not limited to, behavior, credit recovery, specialized programs, and disciplinary actions.

It is recommended that the **request for a statewide waiver of Policy 4336 for transporting students to alternative education sites be approved.**

5. Amendment of Mingo County's 2020-2030 Comprehensive Educational Facilities Plan (CEFP) - (Action)

Policy 6200 requires all local boards of education to submit amendments to CEFPs to the West Virginia Board of Education (WVBE) and the School Building Authority of West Virginia (WVSBA) for approval. The Mingo County Board of Education requests approval to amend its CEFP to more accurately reflect current enrollment trends, facility needs, and safety concerns. Key areas of focus include a slip repair, an eight-classroom addition, safety and security upgrades, HVAC system improvements, roof replacements, paving, door and window replacements, and enhancements to the athletic facilities. This focused approach ensures resources are directed toward the most critical needs, supporting safe and effective learning environments across the district. The projects are planned to be funded through local funds and grants from the WVSBA.

It is recommended that the **Mingo County Board of Education's request to amend their 2020-2030 CEFP be approved.**

6. Amendment of Cabell County's 2020-2030 Comprehensive Educational Facilities Plan (CEFP) - (Action)

Policy 6200 requires all local boards of education to submit amendments to CEFPs to the WVBE and the WVSBA for approval. The Cabell County Board of Education requests approval to amend its CEFP to include the replacement of the roof at the Woody Williams Center for Advanced Learning and Careers. The project is planned to be funded through local funds and a grant from the WVSBA.

7. Amendment of Webster County's 2020-2030 Comprehensive Educational Facilities Plan (CEFP) - (Action)

Policy 6200 requires all local boards of education to submit amendments to CEFPs to the WVBE and the WVSBA for approval. The Webster County Board of Education requests approval to revise its project priority list to include a Career Technical Education upgrade and renovation at Webster County High School, HVAC renovations and/or replacements, security upgrades, and other interior and exterior renovations throughout the county. Other changes include removing projects that have been completed or no longer meet the goals and/or vision of the county. The projects are planned to be funded through local funds and grants from the WVSBA.

8. Amendment of Monongalia County's 2020-2030 Comprehensive Educational Facilities Plan (CEFP) - (Action)

These new top priorities include structural repairs and roof replacement at Mountainview Elementary School, auditorium renovations at Morgantown High School, roof replacement at Mason-Dixon Elementary School, and new windows at North Elementary School. The projects are planned to be funded through local funds and grants from the WVSBA.
