Purpose

Participants will actively explore the SDI Guidance Document to locate key information and deepen their knowledge of Specially Designed Instruction (SDI).

Section 1: What is SDI?

Find the definition of SDI in the document. Highlight the three main elements that can be adapted.

Bonus: Identify the landmark court case cited and summarize why it matters for SDI.

Section 2: Elements of SDI

Identify one example of a content adaptation and one example of a methodology adaptation.

Bonus: Locate an example of how delivery of instruction can be adapted.

Section 3: Myths and Misconceptions

Record one myth about SDI and the fact that corrects it.

Bonus: Find a myth that connects directly to inclusive practices in the general education classroom.

Section 4: Roles and Responsibilities

List two responsibilities of general educators and two of special educators in delivering SDI.

Bonus: Identify who else besides teachers can deliver SDI according to the document.

Section 5: Strategies

Select two SDI strategies and summarize how each works.

Bonus: Write down the disability categories that might benefit most from one of the strategies.

Section 6: Planning

Name the three parts of the WVDE SDI Planning Template.

Bonus: Identify another planning tool mentioned in this section.

Section 7: FAQs

Locate the FAQ that explains whether SDI is 'just good teaching.'
Write the key point.

Bonus: Find the FAQ that explains how often SDI should be provided.
