The Berkeley County Board of Education requests approval to amend its CEFP to include the expansion of the kitchen and gym/cafeteria at Tomahawk Elementary School, Spring Mills Campus roadway improvements, Queen Street district office facility improvements, cafeteria and kitchen updates at Musselman and Martinsburg High Schools, HVAC upgrades throughout the county, adaptive reuse of an existing facility for a regional CTE Center, reconfiguration of Gerrardstown Elementary School, and removal of New South Berkeley Intermediate School from the priority list. The projects are planned to be funded through local funds and potential SBA grants.

It is recommended that the Berkeley County Board of Education's request to amend their 2020-2030 CEFP be approved.

4. Amendment of Mason County's 2020-2030 Comprehensive Educational Facilities Plan (CEFP) – (Action)

Policy 6200 requires all local boards of education to submit amendments to CEFPs to the WVBE and the SBA for approval. The Mason County Board of Education requests approval to amend its CEFP to include the expansion of a Diesel Technology Program at Mason County Career Center. The Barbour County Board of Education requests approval to revise its CEFP to reflect the proposed closures of Belington Middle School, Kasson Elementary/Middle School (Grades 6-8 only), and Philippi Middle School, and to consolidate them into Philip Barbour High School beginning with the 2026-2027 school year. In addition, Grade 5 students from Philippi Middle School are proposed to be merged into Philippi Elementary School, and Grade 5 students from Belington Middle School are proposed to be merged into Belington Elementary School for the 2026-2027 school year. The Barbour County Board of Education further requests approval to include the closure of Junior Elementary School at the end of the 2026–2027 school year and to merge all students from Junior Elementary School and Belington Elementary School into the vacated Belington Middle School building beginning with the 2027–2028 school year.

It is recommended that Barbour County Board of Education's request to amend their 2020-2030 CEFP be approved.

B. Barbour County Schools – Closure of Belington Middle School, Kasson Elementary/Middle School (Grades 6-8 only), and Philippi Middle School, and their consolidation into Philip Barbour High School. Closure of Junior Elementary School and its consolidation into Belington Elementary School. Merger of Grade 5 students from the closing middle schools to their respective elementary schools – (Action)

The Barbour County Board of Education respectfully requests approval to close Belington Middle School, Kasson Elementary/Middle School (Grades 6-8 only), and Philippi Middle School, and to consolidate them into Philip Barbour High School beginning with the 2026-2027 school year. In addition, Grade 5 students from Philippi Middle School will be merged into Philippi Elementary School, and Grade

5 students from Belington Middle School will be merged into Belington Elementary School for the 2026-2027 school year. The Barbour County Board of Education further requests approval to close Junior Elementary School at the end of the 2026–2027 school year and to merge all students from Junior Elementary School and Belington Elementary School into the vacated Belington Middle School building beginning with the 2027–2028 school year.

In consideration of this closure, applicable WVBE policies were reviewed and followed, and documents were available for public inspection for the required period. Separate hearings were held for Kassan Elementary/Middle School on October 28, 2025; Philippi Middle School on October 28, 2025; Belington Middle School on October 29, 2025; and Philip Barbour High School on October 29, 2025. The Barbour County Board of Education approved these closures at its November 10, 2025, board meeting.

Based on the information provided, it is recommended that the closure of Belington Middle School, Kasson Elementary/Middle School (Grades 6-8 only), and Philippi Middle School, and their consolidation into Philip Barbour High School; the merger of respective middle school Grade 5 students into Philippi Elementary School and Belington Elementary School; and the closure of Junior Elementary School and its consolidation into Belington Elementary School be approved.

C. Amendment of Logan County Schools' 2020-2030 Comprehensive Educational Facilities Plan (CEFP) – (Action) Micah Whitlow and Superintendent Sonya White

Policy 6200 requires all local boards of education to submit amendments to CEFPs to the WVBE and the SBA for approval. Michele Blatt, State Superintendent of Schools, in her acting capacity as the Board of Education in Logan County, requests approval to revise Logan County's 2020-2030 CEFP to include the closure of Verdunville Elementary School and its merger into Omar Elementary School. This amendment also reprioritizes multiple projects to reflect current facility needs. In consideration of this closure, applicable WVBE policies were reviewed and followed, and documents were available for public inspection for the required period. Separate hearings were held for Verdunville Elementary School and Omar Elementary School on November 18, 2025.

In addition, a waiver of WVBE Policy 4336 is being requested to create bus routes that exceed the recommended transportation time for elementary students.

Michele Blatt, State Superintendent of Schools, in her acting capacity as the Board of Education in Logan County, approved this closure as an agenda item on the Logan County Board of Education's December 2, 2025, board agenda.

Based on the information provided, it is recommended that the closure of Verdunville Elementary School, its consolidation into Omar Elementary School, and the related Policy 4336 waiver request be approved.

The Randolph County Board of Education approved these closures at its October 8, 2025, board meeting.

In addition, the Randolph County Board of Education requests a waiver of WVBE Policy 4336 for creating bus routes that will exceed the recommended duration of transportation time for elementary students.

Based on the information provided, it is recommended that the closure of Harman K-12 School, its merger into Jennings Randolph Elementary School, Elkins Middle School, and Elkins High School; closure of North Elementary School and its merger into Jennings Randolph Elementary School; and the related Policy 4336 waiver request be approved.

These closures are not contingent on any other actions and are proposed to occur at the end of the 2025-2026 school year.

In consideration of this closure, applicable WVBE policies were reviewed and followed, and documents were available for public inspection for the required period. Public hearings were held on October 27, 2025, for Walton Elementary Middle School; October 28, 2025, for Geary Elementary Middle School; October 29, 2025, for Spencer Elementary School; November 3, 2025, for Spencer Middle School; and November 4, 2025, for Roane County High School. The Roane County Board of Education approved this closure at its November 6, 2025, board meeting.

In addition, the Roane County Board of Education requests a waiver of WVBE Policy 4336 for creating bus routes that will exceed the recommended duration of transportation time for elementary students.

Based on the information provided, it is recommended that the closure of Geary Elementary-Middle School and Walton Elementary-Middle School, and their consolidation into Spencer Elementary School and Spencer Middle School; the consolidation of all Roane County PreK students into a defined space at Roane County High School; and the related Policy 4336 waiver request be approved.
