- Title II Preparing, Training, and Recruiting High-Quality Teachers, Principals, or Other School Leaders
- Title III Language Instruction for English Learners and Immigrant Students
- Title IV 21st Century Schools
- Title V State Innovation and Local Flexibility
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#### **Timeline**

 FY16 Formula allocations to LEAs will be made in the same manner and using the same allocation formulas as 15-16 funding cycle.



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#### **Timeline**

- LEAs will continue to implement the program in the 16-17 school year in accordance with NCLB requirements as they existed in the 15-16 school year.
  - with a few exceptions



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# **Exceptions**

- NCLB required with which the LEA need not comply during the 2016-17 school year:
  - Requirement that LEA report performance against AMOs
  - Requirement that a school notify parents when their child has been assigned to or is being taught be a non-highly qualified teacher

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#### **Exceptions**

- Requirement that LEA hire highly qualified teachers; that LEA report on progress toward all teachers being highly qualified
- Requirement that an LEA not making progress toward all teachers being highly qualified create and implement an improvement plan



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# **Exceptions**

 Requirement that LEA receiving Title III funds that fails to meet one or more AMAOs provide notice to parents of such failure.



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# Flexibility Waiver

- ESSA will render the State's NCLB Flex Waiver null and void on August 1, 2016.
  - No more option to have a Support School Set-Aside out of Title I
    - Can still do Priority and Focus School Set-Asides



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# Priority and Focus Schools

- List of schools will be frozen as of December 9, 2015. No schools will be exited and plans will continue to be implemented throughout the 2016-2017 school year.
  - No more support schools



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#### Priority and Focus Schools


- SEA does not plan on issuing any new 1003(a) grants for the 16-17 school year.
  - Exceptions on a case-by-case basis
- Will begin issuing new 1003(a) funding in FY2018 for newly identified schools.
- No more 1003(g) funding.
- 1003(a) funding pool will increase in FY18



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#### Federally Funded Positions

- Highly Qualified requirements are no longer included under ESSA
  - State will determine what certification requirements are necessary in order to be federally funded



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# WVBE Policy 5202

- PG 14. 126-136-8 Teachers and Paraprofessionals in Federally-Funded Programs
  - Effective with the 17-18 school year, all teachers and paraprofessionals in Federallyfunded programs must meet applicable state certification and licensure requirements



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#### **Tuition Reimbursement**

- New certification requirements will change the way tuition reimbursement is paid with ESSA funding
  - Shift to retention vs. recruitment





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#### **Private School Allocation**

- Continue to provide services to eligible students who attend private schools
- New rules related to calculating private school share of Title I



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#### **Private School Allocation**

- LEAs must calculate private school funding prior to any other expenditures or transfers
  - Private schools now entitled to fair share of LEA non-administrative set-asides such as:
    - Districtwide instruction
    - PD
    - Parent Involvement



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#### **Private School Allocation**

- Equitable service requirements do not apply to reservations from which an LEA provides services to a specific subgroup of students
  - Homeless students
  - Neglected and delinquent
  - Focus/Priority schools



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#### **Private School Allocation**

- Funds allocated for services to eligible private school children shall be obligated in the fiscal year they are received by the LEA
  - Private schools not entitled to carryover under ESSA



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ENSURING EDUCATIONAL STABILITY FOR CHILDREN IN FOSTER CARE



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#### Foster Children

- New requirement for Title I services to foster children
  - Takes effect December 10, 2016
  - LEAs must begin planning now in collaboration with child welfare agencies
  - Children awaiting foster care have been removed from McKinney Vento and now fall under Title I

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#### Foster Children

- LEA must consult with welfare agencies to ensure that foster child:
  - Remains in school or origin if in best interest to child
  - Immediately enrolled in new school even if unable to produce records required for enrollment



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#### Foster Children

- If an LEA offers a public preschool
  - Title I foster child requirements apply to preschool of origin as well



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#### Foster Children

- These requirements apply to <u>all</u> children in foster care enrolled in schools in the LEA
  - Title I school status does not matter



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#### Foster Children

- LEA will work with welfare agencies to determine what services are needed and who will provide the funding.
- Funds reserved for services to homeless children and youth may not be used to pay for these services.




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#### Foster Children

- LEA must identify a point of contact to handle Title I services to foster children
  - Must notify welfare agency of the individual who will serve as the POC

# Maintenance of Effort New MOE rules for FY18 funding LEAs must continue to spend at least 90% of the state and local funds that they spent in the prior year New flexibility for not meeting MOE for 1yr – Title I only reduces if the LEA failed MOE more than once in the past five years

# Maintenance of Effort • Programs covered under MOE - Title II - Title III - Title IV - Title V

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#### Prohibited Use of Funds

- ESSA prohibits grant spending funds on the following unless specifically authorized by a program
  - School construction, renovation or repair
  - Transportation



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# Supplement not Supplant

- Current Test:
  - 1. Required to be made available under other federal, state, or local laws
  - 2. Provided with non-federal funds in prior year
  - 3. Provided services to Title I students and the same services were provided to non-Title I students using state or local funds



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#### Supplement not Supplant

- New rules for testing SNS for Title I

   Expected to begin in 2018-19
- No longer look at individual costs to determine if supplemental
- LEAs must show that each Title I school receives all the state and local funding it would otherwise



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#### **New Reporting Requirement**

- <u>Districts must report the per-pupil</u>
   expenditures of Federal, State and local
   funds, including actual personnel and non personnel expenditures for each school
  - Must submit a plan to the SEA by December 10, 2017 on how LEA will fully meet this requirement by the 2019-2020 school year
