Alternative fuel calculation is based upon portion of bus fleet that uses alternative fuel. A fleet report is obtained from WVEIS WEB detailing the mileage of each bus that uses alternative fuel. The allocation factor is based on that relationship.

Any school district utilizing alternative fuels is responsible for notifying the WVDE Office of student Transportation by June 30 of the year in which such use began. If the school district discontinues use of alternative fuels, notification must be made by June 30 of the year in which such use ceases. A plan must be on file at WVDE for each school district utilizing alternative fuels to receive the additional funding through the Public School bupport Program.

Funding for use of alternative fuels begins the year after such use is implemented and reported to WVDE. It is also contingent upon proper coding of the fuel type utilized in each bus on the bus fleet report.


