## Proclamation by Governor Jim Justice

Whereas, summer is a difficult time for children who depend on school meals as their primary source of nutrition during the school year; and

Whereas, ninety-four percent of West Virginia students who rely on these meals do not participate in the Summer Food Service Program; and

Whereas, through partnership and collaboration, the State of West Virginia has made tremendous strides in improving access to nutritious meals for children during the summer; and

Whereas, the West Virginia Department of Education, Office of Child Nutrition, administers the USDA Summer Food Service Program to ensure that children can continue to receive nutritious meals during the summer at locations such as community centers, faith-based locations, parks and schools; and

Whereas, the West Virginia Department of Education plays a significant role in helping schools provide meals to children in need during the summer; and

Whereas, it is critical to raise public awareness of hunger and nutrition, the necessity of the Summer Food Service Program, and the importance of increased access to the various meal sites in communities throughout West Virginia; and

Whereas, West Virginians can text "Food" to 877-877 to find free summer meal sites near them.

**Now, Therefore,** Be it Resolved that I, Jim Justice, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *June 8, 2018* as:

## Summer Food Service Program Day

in the Mountain State and encourage potential organizations that are not participating to make this program a vital component of their communities, recognize its importance and express the benefits of the program to parents, and to also encourage children to receive nutritious meals at a site near them.
