Local School Improvement Council "Town Hall" Meeting





What is the "Town Hall" LSIC meeting?

This meeting, held at least annually by each LSIC, is intended to be an opportunity for attendees to make specific suggestions on how to address issues which are seen to affect the school's academic performance.

Why is this meeting necessary?

WVBE Policy 2322 directs that each LSIC shall conduct at least one meeting to engage parents, students, employees, business partners, and other interested parties in a positive and interactive dialogue regarding the school's academic performance and standing as determined by measures adopted by the WVBE.

What issues are to be discussed during this meeting?

Any issue which is seen to affect the school's academic performance which may include parent and community involvement, the learning environment, student engagement, attendance, supports for at-risk students, curricular offerings, resources, and the capacity for school improvement.

What are the notification requirements for the "Town Hall" meeting?

Policy 2322 provides that the council shall announce any such meetings ten employment days in advance. Best practice would include notification by multiple means such as digital signage, newsletters, phone calls, email, social media, and other forms of communication.
