C. Statewide Waivers of Policy 5202, Minimum Requirements for the Licensure of Professional/Paraprofessional Personnel and Advanced Salary Classifications, Section 11.6.b.2, and Policy 5100, Approval of Educator Preparation Programs, Section 10.4.e - (Action)

Statewide waivers of Policies 5202 and 5100 are requested to allow student teachers/resident teachers who have attempted the content Praxis two or more times without meeting the required cut score, and who have a B or better grade point average in their content area, to be eligible for a Restricted Clinical Experience Permit and complete the clinical placement under focused supervision of institutional officials and assigned supervising/ cooperating teachers. If unable to meet the required scores on the content Praxis at the time of application and employment, candidates would be eligible for a one-year Temporary License. During that year the individual must either successfully complete the Praxis content exam or the edTPA (at a WVDE-specified score) teacher performance assessment to convert it to an initial professional certificate. Policies 5202 and 5100 are being amended to include this flexibility; both policies are anticipated to be approved and in effect no later than December 31, 2023.

It is recommended a motion is requested that statewide waivers of Policy 5202, section 11.6.b.2, and Policy 5100, section 10.4.e, be approved through December 31, 2023.

4. Clinical Teacher of Record (CTR) Program Addition: Marshall University with Jackson County and Nicholas County - (Action) Carla Warren

On December 2022, the West Virginia Educator Preparation Program Review Board (EPPRB) members agreed on a recommendation of approval to the WVBE of a CTR Program addition for Marshall University with Jackson County and Nicholas County. Policy 5100 provides guidelines and procedures for the approval of new and continuing educator preparation programs of study leading to licensure in West Virginia and also for CTR Agreements with West Virginia school districts. Policy 5100 supports the intended collaborative process to improve educator preparation programs and potential educators by incorporating program guidelines based on research and best practices. Support of continuous improvement and clear and consistent guidelines to West Virginia educator preparation programs will produce more effective educators in West Virginia schools, resulting in increased student learning in the classroom.

It is recommended that the WVBE accept the EPPRB's recommendation of approval of the addition of a CTR Program for Marshall University with Jackson County and Nicholas County.
