Brooke, Putnam, and Ohio Counties have requested a first-time waiver of Policy 2510, Appendix B: Training Required in Policy 2510, related to professional development for Advanced Placement® (AP®) teachers. Brooke County requests a waiver for one new teacher of AP® US Government and Politics at Brooke High School; Putnam County requests a waiver for one new teacher of AP® English at Hurricane High School; and Ohio County requests a waiver for one teacher of AP® French at Wheeling Park High School. The teachers began their assignments after the AP® Summer Institute and will be required to attend the AP® training during the next summer trainings (2023) in order to continue teaching the courses in future years. The waivers and waiver criteria have been reviewed by WVDE staff. If granted, the waivers will provide students at Brooke High School access to AP® US Government and Politics, students at Hurricane High School access to AP® English, and students at Wheeling Park High School access to AP® French during school year 2022-23.

It is recommended that: 1) Brooke County's request for a waiver of required professional development for one new teacher of AP® US Government and Politics; 2) Putnam County's request for a waiver of

required professional development for one new teacher of AP® English; and 3) Ohio County's request for a waiver of required professional development for one teacher of AP® French at Wheeling Park High School be approved for school year 2022-2023.

5. Policy 2419, Regulations for the Education of Students with Attachment H Exceptionalities - (Action) Sheila Paitsel

Policy 2419 is West Virginia's implementation of the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This policy was recently revised and went into effect on November 14, 2022. Omission of language in Chapter 4 and terminology inconsistent with IDEA in Chapter 9 dictate that updates are necessary to these two sections to correct current state and federal language. No comments were received during the comment period.

It is recommended that Policy 2419 be approved and effective 30 days from filing.

In December 2022, AAQEP issued their accreditation decision to Wheeling University, who hosted full on-site reviews in the Fall of 2022. Wheeling University received the decision of Full Accreditation for seven years The West Virginia Educator Preparation Program Review Board (EPPRB) members met in January 2023 and agreed on the AAQEP decision and recommend the status as listed above and for Wheeling University to be removed from the WVDE Corrective Action Plan.

It is recommended that the WVBE accept the AAQEP decision and EPPRB's recommendation of Full Accreditation for Wheeling University and to remove the institution from the WVDE Corrective Action Plan.
