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GASB Statements Effective for FY23

- GASB 99: Omnibus 2022
 - Majority of topics covered are effective upon issuance.
 - Requirements related to leases, Public-Private and Public-Public Partnerships (PPP)s, and SBITAs are effective for FY23.
 - The requirements related to financial guarantees and the classification and reporting of derivative instruments within the scope of Statement 53 are effective for FY24.



- GASB 99: Omnibus 2022
 - Disclosure of Nonmonetary Transactions
 - If an entity engages in one or more nonmonetary transactions during the fiscal year, they will need to disclose those transactions in the notes to the financial statements the measurement of attribute(s) applied to the assets transferred, rather than basis of accounting for those assets.
 - Exchange or exchange-like financial guarantees (FY24)
 - Financial guarantees are a guarantee of an obligation of a legally separate entity or individual that requires the guarantor to indemnify a third-part obligation holder under specified conditions, in an exchange or exchange-like transactions.
 - An entity that extends an exchange or exchange-like financial guarantee should
 recognize a liability and expense related to the guarantee when qualitative factors
 and historical data indicate that it is more likely than not an entity will be required to
 make a payment related to the guarantee.



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GASB Statements Effective for FY23

- GASB 99: Omnibus 2022 (continued)
 - Leases
 - Any lease term provisions that grant the lessee or lessor the right to terminate the lease due to certain circumstances or because of the occurrence of an event are not considered options to terminate the lease when determining the lease term.
 - For example, the right to terminate a lease because of default of payment or the action or inaction of the other party should not be considered an option to terminate.
 - If a lease provides an option to purchase the underlying asset, but still meets the
 definition of a lease under GASB 87, the lease term should end as of the purchase
 date, or the date the lessee is reasonably certain to purchase the asset.
 - For purposes of determining if a contract is a financed purchase or a lease, options to
 end the lease due to the purchase of the underlying asset, all payments being paid, or
 a default on payment are not considered options to terminate the lease.



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- GASB 99: Omnibus 2022 (continued)
 - Leases (continued)
 - Variable payments depending on an index or rate or payments that appear variable but are fixed in substance should be included in the measurement of the lease liability or lease receivable.
 - Any other variable payments and payments that depend on either future performance by the lessee or usage of the underlying asset should not be included in the measurement of the lease liability or lease receivable.
 - Lease liabilities and lease receivables should NOT be remeasured if only the index or rate on which variable payments are based changed.
 - The discount rate used to measure the lease liability should NOT be updated if the only change is to the lessee's incremental borrowing rate.
 - Lease incentives should include the assumption of, and also the agreement to, pay
 the lessee's commitments for a preexisting lease or contract.



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GASB Statements Effective for FY23

- GASB 99: Omnibus 2022 (continued)
 - SBITAS
 - When determining the term of the subscription any subscription provisions that grant either party the right to terminate the SBITA due to certain circumstances or because of the occurrence of an event are not considered options to terminate the SBITA.
 - For example, the right to terminate a SBITA because of default of payment or the action or inaction of the other party should not be considered an option to terminate.
 - If a SBITA has been classified as short-term, but at a later date the SBITA is modified in a way that extends the maximum possible period, the SBITA should be reassessed as of its inception to determine if it still meets the criteria for a short-term SBITA.
 - Subscription liabilities should NOT be remeasured if only the index or rate on which variable payments are based changed.
 - The discount rate used to measure the subscription liability should NOT be updated if the only change is a change to the government's incremental borrowing rate.



- GASB 91: Conduit Debt Obligations
 - Definition: a debt instrument issued in the name of a state or local government that is for the benefit of a third party primarily liable for the repayment of the debt.
 - Effective for reporting periods beginning after December 15, 2021 (FY23).
 - The objective of this Statement is to better meet the information needs of financial statement users by enhancing the comparability and consistency of conduit debt obligation reporting and reporting of related transactions and other events.



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GASB Statements Effective for FY23

- GASB 94: Public-Private and Public-Public Partnerships and Availability Payment Arrangements
 - Effective for reporting periods beginning after June 15, 2022 (FY23).
 - Establishes the definitions of PPPs and APAs and provides uniform guidance on accounting and financial reporting for transactions that meet those definitions.



- GASB 94: Public-Private and Public-Public Partnerships and Availability Payment Arrangements (continued)
 - PPP an arrangement in which a government (the transferor) contracts with an
 operator to provide public services by conveying control of the right to operate
 or use a nonfinancial asset, such as infrastructure or other capital asset, for a
 period of time in an exchange or exchange-like transaction
 - APA An arrangement in which a government compensates an operator for activities that may include designing, constructing, financing, maintaining, or operating an underlying nonfinancial asset for a period of time in an exchange or exchange-like transaction
 - APAs are different than PPPs in that the payments made by the government to an operator
 are based entirely on the asset's availability for use rather than on tolls, fees, or similar
 revenues or other measures of demand



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GASB Statements Effective for FY23

- GASB 94: Public-Private and Public-Public Partnerships and Availability Payment Arrangements (continued)
 - Examples
 - The county enters into an agreement with a developer to design/build/operate the construction of a building to be leased for office space for a period of time.
 - The county enters into an agreement with a developer to oversee/manage the construction of a building, and when completed the building ownership transfers back to the County.
 - The county enters into an agreement with a building authority to design/construct/operate a toll bridge.
 - · Probably rare that a county would have these



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- GASB 101: Compensated Absences (continued)
- The new standard defines three general criteria for recognizing a liability for unused leave balances:
 - The leave is attributable to services already rendered;
 - The leave accumulates: and
 - The leave is more likely than not to be used for time off or otherwise paid or settled.
- Requires the county to record a liability for a portion of accrued sick leave, even if that leave does not vest.
 - This is because of the third criterion noted above, the "more likely than not" test.



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GASB Statements Effective for FY23

- GASB 96: Subscription-Based Information Technology Arrangements (SBITAs)
 - Effective for reporting periods beginning after June 15, 2022 (FY23).
 - This Statement provides guidance on the accounting and financial reporting for subscription-based information technology arrangements (SBITAs) for government end users (governments).
 - SBITA Definition:
 - A contract that conveys control of the right to use another party's IT software, alone or in combination with tangible capital assets as specified in the contract for a period of time in an exchange or exchange-like transaction.
 - A SBITA agreement results in an intangible right-to-use asset and a corresponding subscription liability.



- GASB 96: SBITAs (continued)
 - How to determine whether a contract conveys control of the right to use the underlying IT assets.
 - The entity should assess whether it has both of the following:
 - The right to obtain the present service capacity from use of the underlying IT assets as specified in the contract.
 - The right to determine the nature and manner of use of the underlying IT assets as specified in the contract.
 - Hardware that is a part of a SBITA must be accounted for in accordance with GASB 87; the corresponding subscription must be accounted for in accordance with GASB 96.



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
GASB Statements Effective for FY23

- GASB 96: SBITAs (continued)
 - · Does not apply to:
 - Contracts that convey control of the right to use another party's combination of IT software and tangible capital assets that meets the definition of a lease in Statement 87, in which the software component is insignificant compared to the cost of the underlying tangible capital asset.
 - Governments that provide the right to use their IT software and associated tangible capital assets to other entities through SBITAs.



GASB 96: SBITAs (continued)







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GASB Statements Effective for FY23

- GASB 96: SBITAs (continued)
 - Recognition and measurement
 - Once a SBITA is identified, the county would recognize a subscription liability and a subscription asset at the commencement of the subscription term of the SBITA, which occurs when the county obtains control of the right to use the underlying IT asset.
 - The subscription term is the period that the government has the noncancelable right to use the underlying IT assets, plus the following periods, if applicable:
 - Periods covered by a county's extension option if it is reasonably certain that the county WILL exercise
 that option.
 - Periods covered by a county's termination option if it is reasonably certain that the county WILL NOT exercise that option.
 - Periods covered by a vendor's extension option if it is reasonably certain that the SBITA vendor WILL exercise that option.
 - Periods covered by a vendor's termination option if it is reasonably certain that the vendor WILL NOT exercise that option.



- GASB 96: SBITAs (continued)
 - Subscription Liability
 - Like GASB 87: Leases, the initial subscription liability is measured as the present value of the total subscription payments expected to be made.
 - The total future payments are discounted using either the interest rate the vendor charges the government or the implicit interest rate.
 - If the implicit interest rate is not readily determinable, the government may use an estimated incremental borrowing rate.



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GASB Statements Effective for FY23

- GASB 96: SBITAs (continued)
 - Subscription Liability (continued)
 - Payments that should be included in the PV calculation of the subscription liability:
 - Fixed payments
 - Variable payments based on an index or a rate, measured using the index or rate as of the commencement of the subscription term
 - · Variable payments that are fixed in substance
 - Termination penalties, if the subscription term reflects the government exercising either an
 option to terminate the agreement or a fiscal funding or cancellation clause
 - · Incentives receivable from the vendor
 - Other payments the government is reasonably certain will be required to be made to the vendor



- GASB 96: SBITAs (continued)
 - Subscription Asset
 - Measured as the initial value of the subscription liability plus:
 - payments made to the vendor at the commencement of the subscription term
 - capitalizable initial implementation costs
 - minus any vendor incentives received at the commencement of the subscription term
 - The county will then amortize the subscription asset in a systematic and rational manner over the shorter of the subscription term or the useful life of the underlying IT asset.



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GASB Statements Effective for FY23

- GASB 96: SBITAs (continued)
 - Other Outlays
 - In addition to subscription payments, there may be cash outlays for other activities associated
 with SBITAs. The type and timing of the activity dictates the accounting treatment of these cash
 outlays. Other activities associated with SBITAs are grouped into three stages:

Stage	Activities	Accounting
Preliminary Project Stage	 Conceptual formulation Evaluation of alternatives Selection of vendor 	Expense as incurred
Initial Implementation Stage	 Configuration Coding Testing Installation 	Generally capitalized as an addition to the subscription asset
Operations and Additional Implementation Stage	 Subsequent implementation activities Maintenance Troubleshooting 	Expense as incurred, unless activity meets specific capitalization criteria



- GASB 100: Accounting Changes and Error Corrections
 - The requirements of this Statement are effective for accounting changes and error corrections made in fiscal years beginning after June 15, 2023 (FY24)
 - The primary objective of this Statement is to enhance the accounting and financial reporting requirements for accounting changes and error corrections to provide more understandable, reliable, relevant, consistent, and comparable information for making decisions or assessing accountability.



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GASB Statements Effective for FY25

- GASB 101: Compensated Absences
 - The requirements of this Statement are effective for fiscal years beginning after December 15, 2023 (FY25)
 - The objective of this Statement is to better meet the information needs of financial statement users by updating the recognition and measurement guidance for compensated absences.




- GASB 101: Compensated Absences (continued)
- The new standard defines three general criteria for recognizing a liability for unused leave balances:
 - The leave is attributable to services already rendered;
 - The leave accumulates; and
 - The leave is more likely than not to be used for time off or otherwise paid or settled.
- Requires the county to record a liability for a portion of accrued sick leave, even if that leave does not vest.
 - This is because of the third criterion noted above, the "more likely than not" test.



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Year-End Closing

- Year-end closing entries are needed to record activity for the fiscal year that occurred after June 30th or to adjust for subsequent fiscal year activity that occurred during the current fiscal year.
- Fund financial statements are prepared using the "current financial resources measurement focus" and the "modified accrual basis of accounting."
 - Revenue is recognized when "measurable and available"
 - Revenue is available for all LEAs, ESCs, and MCVCs if received within 60
 - days after year-end.
 Revenue is "measurable" when the amount of the transaction can be determined.
 - Expenditures are generally recorded when the related fund liability is incurred, except:
 - · Unmatured principal and interest on general long-term debt,
 - Claims and judgments, and
 - Compensated absences.



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Year-End Closing: Revenue

- Since revenues must be recognized when collected within 60 days after year-end, LEAs must keep track of all receipts collected during July and August, but that relate to the most recent fiscal
- Tracking the subsequent collections of year-end revenues allows LEAs to calculate the total amount of deferred inflows.
- Revenue recognition grants received in advance:
 - Nonexchange transactions two types common to school boards:
 - Government-mandated a government at one level provides resources to a government at another level and requires the recipient to use the resources for
 - Voluntary legislative or contractual agreements, other than exchanges, entered into willingly by the parties to the agreement.
- Eligibility requirements must be met to recognize revenue.



- Eligibility requirements:
 - Required <u>characteristics of recipients</u> as specified by the provider have been met.
 - <u>Time requirements</u> (the period when the resources are required to be used or when use is first permitted) have been met.
 - <u>Reimbursements</u> expenditure-driven grants where the recipient must incur allowable costs prior to requesting drawdown of the funds from the grantor.
 - Federal awards generally fall under this requirement. Therefore, federal revenue is typically recognized when the other eligibility requirements are met AND allowable costs have been incurred by the LEA.
 - State awards are generally NOT expenditure-driven. Therefore, state revenue is typically recognized as soon as the other eligibility requirements are met.
 - <u>Contingencies</u> receipt of funds is contingent upon specified actions of the recipient and that action has occurred.



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Year-End Closing: Revenue

- Purpose restrictions eligibility requirements DO NOT include purpose restrictions (GASB 33, par. 62).
 - Can only be met when a transaction has already occurred.
 - Only affect fund balance categories (not revenue recognition).
- Revenue recognition under GASB 33:
 - Grant funds received in a period BEFORE the grant period begins:
 - Time requirement has not been met. Therefore, revenue cannot be recognized when the funds are received.
 - Funds received should be recorded as deferred inflows of resources.
 - Grant funds received DURING the grant period:
 - Time requirement has been met.
 - Funds received are immediately recognized as revenue (assuming other eligibility requirements have been met as well).
 - Purpose restrictions are not considered for revenue recognition. Therefore, revenue is not recognized as expenditures are made against the project/grant.
 - This also applies to multiple-year grant awards.



- Example (Food Svc): Total Food Service billings for FY23 were \$250,000. Collections through June 2023 totaled \$150,000 and collections during July and August 2023 totaled \$25,000.
 - Assuming all balances are collectible, the total deferred inflows of resources at June 30, 2023 is calculated as follows:

Total billings for FY23: \$250,000
 Less Collections through June: (150,000)
 Less Collections July - August: (25,000)
 Total Deferred Inflows: \$75,000

• The \$75,000 balance of deferred inflows of resources is considered to be "unavailable" under the current financial resources measurement focus. Therefore, it is not reported in current year fund level revenue. However, it is still included in accounts receivable at year-end.



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Year-End Closing: Revenue

- Using the example from the previous slide, the total revenue recognized for FY23 and the remaining receivable balance at year-end are:
 - FY23 Revenue Recognition:

Total billings for FY23: \$250,000
 Less unavailable receivables: (75,000)
 Total FY23 Revenue recognized: \$175,000

• June 30, 2023 Accounts Receivable:

Total billings for FY23: \$250,000
 Less collections through June 30th: (150,000)
 Accounts Receivable at June 30th: \$100,000



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 The year-end WVEIS closing entry for the example on slide 7 would be:

dr. 11..00153.001 Other A/R \$100,000 cr. 11..00601.006 Deferred Inflows \$75,000 cr. 11..01989.009 Revenue \$25,000

 Remember that the \$150,000 of collections made through June 30, 2023, should already be recognized as revenue at the time the month of June was closed (beginning of July).



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Year-End Closing: Revenue

- Accrued Property Taxes
 - OSF's official guidance on year-end property tax entries can be found at: https://wvde.us/finance-and-administration/school-finance/workshops/workshop-2015/. Then select the property tax year end entries handout.
 - All LEAs are expected to utilize OSF guidance when such guidance has been made available.
 - However, auditors should consider the methods used by each county to determine whether those methods are appropriate and whether those methods materially misstate the financial statement balances related to property taxes.



- Examples of deferred inflow year-end entries are:
 - Property taxes
 - · Food service collections
 - E-Rate
 - Medicaid
 - · Federal reimbursements/drawdowns
 - · Bank interest income

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Year-End Closing: Expenditures

- Types of year-end closing entries for expenditures:
 - Prepaid Expenditures/Expenses Cash paid prior to year-end for a cost relating to a subsequent period.
 - Liabilities Cash paid after year-end for a cost incurred prior to year-end.
 - Liabilities Invoices received and unpaid for costs incurred prior to yearend.
 - Non-cash accruals (i.e. accrued interest on debt, retainage payable, etc.)
- Common examples of prepaid expenditures are:
 - Insurance premiums relating to a subsequent period (i.e. flood, liability, vehicle, etc.)
 - Workers' compensation premiums paid in advance of the coverage period.



Year-End Closing: Expenditures

- To record a prepaid expenditure, you must calculate the amount of the payment that relates to the subsequent period.
- Example: Workers' Comp. premium paid in March 2023 (\$300,000) with a coverage period of April 2023 through September 2023.
 - Of the 6-month policy period, only 3 months related the current fiscal year. Therefore, the other 3 months are prepaid.
 - Since exactly one half of the policy period relates to a subsequent period, half of the premium must be recorded as prepaid expenditure.
 - Dr. 11..00183.001 Prepaid workers' comp \$150,000
 Cr. 11..XXXXX.261 Workers' Comp. Exp. \$150,000



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Year-End Closing: Expenditures

- Since many of the invoices relating to costs incurred during FY23 will be received after June 30th, LEAs must make manual adjustments within WVEIS to recognize those invoices as expenditures and liabilities.
- Analysis of July and August checks can be a good way to ensure all invoices related to the fiscal year being closed have been accrued to accounts payable at June 30^{th.}
- Please note that you must also accrue liabilities for any invoice relating to the fiscal year being closed whether paid within 60 days or not.
 - If, at the time the financial statements are prepared, you are aware of an invoice/incurred expenditure that relates to the fiscal year being closed, you should accrue the expenditure as a liability at June 30^{th.}



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Year-End Closing: Expenditures

- LEAs must also make expenditure adjustments at year-end for non-cash accruals such as:
 - · Food service sponsor contribution transfer
 - · Indirect cost transfers
 - · Tools for Schools allocation
 - Unfunded retirement allocation
 - Retainage payable on current construction contracts
 - · Reclassification of deferred pays to cash
 - Accrued interest payable



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Year-End Closing: Fund Balance

- The final entries you will need to make in WVEIS are to adjust the ending balances of your various fund balance accounts:
 - · Non-spendable
 - Restricted
 - Committed
 - Assigned
- Non-spendable fund balance consists of items that are not spendable in form or are legally required to remain intact:
 - Inventories
 - Prepaid expenditures (including TDC forfeitures)
 - Endowment
 - Often understated or missed completely.
 - Very easy to check balance for reasonableness since it is tied directly to some asset balances.



Year-End Closing: Fund Balance

- Restricted fund balance consists of balances containing use constraints that are <u>externally</u> enforceable.
 - · Pass-through entity restrictions such as WVDE or feds.
 - Excess levies.
 - Restrictions due to laws or regulations of other governments.
- Committed fund balance Use constraints placed on funds by the highest decision-making body within the government (local board).
 - Must have required action by the Board to restrict the funds.
 - Must also require Board action to remove those restrictions.
 - Board action must have taken place prior to the end of the reporting period.
- Assigned fund balance Use constraints placed on funds by others within the government (superintendent or treasurer).
 - Does not require direct Board action to add or remove use constraints.
 - · Less formal action necessary.
 - Action can take place before or after the end of the reporting period.



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Year-End Closing: Fund Balance

- Valid WVEIS account codes for fund balances are:
 - Non-spendable XX..00751.007
 - Restricted XX..00752.007
 - Committed XX..00771.007
 - Assigned XX..00753.007
 - Unassigned XX..00772.007
- You should adjust non-spendable, restricted, committed, and assigned fund balances to their known year-end balances by adjusting the residual balance of the unassigned category.




Year-End Closing: Final Steps

- Once you are comfortable that all year-end closing-entries have been posted in WVEIS, you should:
 - Close out the 13th month and submit the data file to WVDE (same due date as financial statement submission to WVDE).
 - Run WVEIS reports to use in preparation of the annual financial statements.
- Common year-end WVEIS reports to utilize during financial statement preparation:
 - Balance sheet for each fund being maintained by the Board
 - Revenue by source report for each fund
 - Revenue by project for all funds
 - Expenditure by function report for each fund
 - Fixed asset listing and depreciation report
 - Note that you must ensure that all fixed asset activity for the reporting period must be updated within the WVEIS capital asset module.
 - This report will be used for the governmental conversion.



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Financial Statements: Introduction

- MD&A template has been rolled to FY23.
- Note disclosures template is still in the process of being rolled to FY23.
- Excel template has been rolled to FY23:
 - The financial statement Excel template will continue to be separated into 3 files:
 - Financial Statement Template 23
 - GASB 68 Template 23
 - GASB 75 Template 23
 - We anticipate release of all financial statement templates and related files by the first week of August 2022.



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Financial Statements: GASB 68 Update

- The audited TRS GASB 68 schedules for the measurement period ending June 30, 2022 have already been released and are available on CPRB's website.
- GASB 68 has its own stand-alone template.
 - Builds GASB 68 conversion entries, notes, and RSI schedules.
 - Allows counties to continue to use their own Excel financial statement template for the basic financial statements.
 - Prevents multiple versions of the main Excel template due to changes in GASB 68 information.



Financial Statements: GASB 75 Update

- The audited RHBT GASB 75 schedules for the measurement period ending June 30, 2021 have already been released and are available on PEIA's website.
- GASB 75 has its own stand-alone template.
 - Builds GASB 75 conversion entries, notes, and RSI schedules.
 - Allows counties to continue to use their own Excel financial statement template for the basic financial statements.
 - Prevents multiple versions of the main Excel template due to changes in GASB 75 information.



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Financial Statements: Preparation

- Key dates:
 - September 15, 2023 Due date for ESC and MCVC financial statements.
 - **September 28, 2023** Due date for LEA financial statements and WVEIS data file submission.
- Item 19 in the Financial Statement Instructions for FY23 includes a summarization of changes made to the financial statement templates when compared to the prior year's template.



Financial Statements: Preparation

- Documents due with submission to OSF:
 - MD&A
 - Government-wide statements
 - All applicable fund basis statements, including fiduciary funds (i.e., school funds)
 - Reconciliation schedules
 - Budgetary comparison schedules for each fund
 - · All applicable notes to the financial statements
 - · WVEIS special projects worksheet, by fund
 - Schedule of excess levy revenues and expenditures, if applicable
 - · Schedule of encumbrances outstanding at year-end
 - · Encumbrance distribution spreadsheet



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Financial Statements: Preparation

- The following additional schedules must be prepared and retained at the central office:
 - List of expenditures in excess of \$250.
 - Schedule of salaries paid to each board member and the superintendent.
 - · Schedule of all debts owed by the board.
- All files required to be submitted to OSF <u>should be sent via e-mail</u> to the OSF coordinator assigned to your county.
 - Lori Elliott (lori.elliott@k12.wv.us) Barbour to McDowell
 - Justin Hannah (Justin.Hannah@k12.wv.us) Mercer to Wyoming



Financial Statements: Preparation

- The financial statement templates should be completed in the following order:
 - Excel files (Any of the files can be completed first. However, the GASB 68 and GASB 75 templates must be completed in order to complete conversion entries in the "JEs" tab of the main financial statement Excel file.)
 - MD&A (Word) and note disclosures (Word)
- Many items in the Excel files link directly to the notes and MD&A, so it is important to complete all three Excel files first.



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Financial Statements: Preparing the Excel Files

- Due to the vast number of formulas and linked values within the Excel files, each tab has been locked to only allow editing in yellow highlighted cells.
- This helps to prevent accidental deletion of links and formulas.
- The current year password to unprotect the worksheets is "BOE2023."
- The password is typed in red/bold font in the top of every protected worksheet and is included within item number 19 of the official Financial Statement Instructions 23 file.
- WATCH WINDOW! the watch window continues to be available for the three Excel files. This allows all users to monitor check figures throughout the template within one window.



- Enter WVEIS balance sheet amounts for each fund into the yellow highlighted cells within the "Gov Funds – Bal Sheet" worksheet.
 - Source: WVEIS Balance Sheet report for each fund maintained by the board.
 - Ensure each category total (i.e., total assets, total liabilities) agrees between the template and the WVEIS report.
 - The only individual balance sheet account that you WILL NOT enter on the worksheet is the <u>unassigned</u> fund balance, which is a calculated field.
 - Also note that you WILL NOT manually enter adjustments within the reconciliation section at the bottom of the balance sheet.
 - Reconciling adjustments will build from the conversion entries "JE" tab and various note disclosure tabs.
 - Reconciliation WILL NOT work until ALL conversion entries and note disclosure tabs are completed.



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Financial Statements: Preparing the Excel Files

- 2. Enter WVEIS revenue amounts for each fund into the yellow highlighted cells within the "Gov Funds Rev-Exp" worksheet.
 - Source: WVEIS revenue by source report for each fund maintained by the board.
 - Enter other financing sources in the appropriate section (revenues entered as negatives).
 - · Proceeds from bond issuance
 - · Proceeds from sale of property
 - Transfers in
 - WVEIS report total should agree to template revenues plus credits to other financing sources.



- Enter WVEIS expenditure amounts for each fund into the yellow highlighted cells within the "Gov Funds – Rev-Exp" worksheet.
 - Source: WVEIS expenditure by function report for each fund maintained by the board.
 - Enter transfers out under the other financing sources section (enter as positive numbers).
 - WVEIS report total should agree to template expenditures plus debits (positive amounts) in the other financing sources section.
- 4. Enter beginning fund balances within the "Gov Funds Rev-Exp" worksheet.
 - Source: Prior year audited financial statements.
- 5. Enter adjustments to beginning fund balances for prior period adjustments, if any.



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Financial Statements: Preparing the Excel Files

- 6. Verify that fund level statements are now in balance.
 - Ensure that the check figure in the right-hand margin of the "Gov Funds Bal Sheet" tab equals zero (Watch Window).
 - This check figure WILL NOT equal zero until all balance sheet, revenue, expenditure, other financing sources, and beginning fund balances have all been entered.
 - DO NOT move on to the next step until the fund statements are in balance.
- 7. Complete the "Fiduciary Funds Net Position" and "Changes in Fiduciary Net Position" tabs.
 - Source: Sum of MCVC, RESA, or other accounts/year-end account balances.
 - Ensure statement balances (Watch Window).



- 8. Complete the "Changes in School Funds" tab in the OSI section of the template.
 - · Sources:
 - Beginning cash balances should come from the ending balances from the prior year audit.
 - Revenues and expenditures will come from year-end schools' financial reports (from TRA SFO for most counties).
- Complete yellow highlighted cells within the "Capital Assets" note disclosure tab.
 - · Sources:
 - Beginning balances should be entered directly from the prior year ending audit balances.
 - Additions are typically entered from invoices accumulated throughout the year.
 - Deletions are typically entered from sales/receipt records or disposal reports.
 - Reconcile schedule to WVEIS capital outlay account balances and WVEIS capital asset module reports.

- 10. Enter depreciation expense by function into the "Notes Cap Assets & Dep." tab.
 - · Source: WVEIS capital asset module depreciation report.
- 11. Complete "long term debt" tab.
 - · Sources:
 - · Compensated absences report
 - · Lease statements from financing companies
 - · Municipal Bond Commission reports
 - Beginning balances should always be entered from the prior year audited financial statements.
 - Future debt service balances should be given for each of the next 5 years with all remaining years aggregated in 5-year increments (GASB 38).



- 12. Complete "Notes Fund Balance" tab.
 - Sources: WVEIS (see slides 18-20)
 - TBD DO NOT leave "TBD" as a category of committed and/or assigned fund balance
 - If the Board did not take action to restrict funds for a <u>specific purpose</u> by June 30th, then the funds are either assigned or unassigned.
 - If management did not make the decision to assign balances for a <u>specific purpose</u> by the time the financials are being prepared, then the funds are unassigned.



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Financial Statements: Preparing the Excel Files

- 13. Complete yellow highlighted sections of each budgetary comparison schedule.
 - · Sources:
 - · Proposed budget reports
 - Revenues Budget by revenue source
 - Expenditures Budget by function
 - · Final budget reports
 - Revenues Budget by revenue source
 - Expenditures Budget by function
 - The budgetary comparison schedules must show the original budget, the final budget, actual results, and a variance column that compares actual results of operations for the year to the final budget.
 - Adjustments column included to account for regulatory basis adjustments.



- 14. Budget Schedules (Continued)
 - Please note that county boards of education are instructed to include in their budgets expenditures related to the unfunded retirement liability allocation (object 235), so adjustment should be <u>un</u>necessary.



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Financial Statements: Preparing the Excel Files

- 15. Complete the "Excess Levy Rev & Exp" tab.
 - Source WVEIS project reports (if excess levy is tracked in a local project), or WVEIS fund 12 reports.
 - Should include a category for each line item on the levy call.
 - New rows should be inserted if necessary (will need to unprotect the worksheet).
- 16. Complete the revenue allocation on the "Rev Alloc" tab.
 - Source: WVEIS revenue by project report aggregated for ALL funds.
 - Key in the project codes, project descriptions, and amounts within columns A, B, and C, respectively.
 - Enter "class codes" into column E (see class code key at the bottom of the worksheet).
 - Only use "revenue classification" codes in column E.



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- 16. Revenue Allocation (Continued)
 - Ensure the check figure at the bottom of column C equals zero (Watch Window).
 - · Key in functional allocation codes for:
 - · Charges for Services
 - Operating Grants & Contributions
 - · Capital Grants & Contributions
 - If functional allocation codes are not entered into columns Y, AC, and AG, the template will allocate the revenues automatically on the "rev check" tab.
 - Please be consistent with how the functional allocation codes are handled (if you used functional allocation codes on the "Rev Alloc" tab last year, continue to use them this year and going forward).
 - Review check figures at the bottom of columns AY, BO, and CE to ensure they are zero (Watch Window).
 - If not zero, likely an issue with broken formulas or linked cells.



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Financial Statements: Preparing the Excel Files

- 17. Review "Rev Check" tab to ensure all revenue has been appropriately allocated for district-wide presentation.
 - Check figure at the bottom of column Q must equal zero (Watch Window).
 - Note that the revenue allocation does not use expenditures from food service, community service, interest, or unallocated depreciation expenses for the basis of calculating the allocation percentages in column C of the "rev check" (that is why the allocation percentages for those categories are hard-keyed as zeros).



18. Conversion entries:

- Needed because the district-wide statements are prepared using the economic resources measurement focus and the full accrual basis of accounting.
 - · Revenues are recorded when earned.
 - Expenses are recorded at the time liabilities are incurred, regardless of when the related cash flows are received.
 - Revenues and expenses resulting from exchange and exchange-like transactions are recognized when the exchange takes place.
 - Revenues and expenses resulting from non-exchange transactions, such as property taxes, federal and state grants, state aid to schools, and donations, are recognized in accordance with the requirements of GASB Statement 33.
 - Property taxes are recognized in the fiscal year for which the taxes are levied.
 - State aid to schools is recognized in the year for which the legislative appropriation is made.
 - Grants and donations are recognized in the fiscal year in which all eligibility requirements have been satisfied.



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Financial Statements: Preparing the Excel Files

18. Conversion entries (continued):

- Complete yellow highlighted cells within the "JEs" tab.
 - · Total debits and credits should equal.
 - No negative amounts should be entered.
 - Any manual changes completed within the "JEs" tab must be manually linked to the trial balance tab.
 - Cells that are not highlighted in yellow are linked from various other tabs within the template.
- JE#s U1 through U5 are created by completing the GASB 68 template. The current entries in the main financial statement Excel template are linked directly to the same entries within the GASB 68 template.
- JE#s U8 through U11 are created by completing the GASB 75 template. The current entries in the main financial statement Excel template are linked directly to the same entries within the GASB 75 template.



- If you are an LEA that does not act as a fiscal agent, you can ignore the light purple tabs in the GASB 68 template.

 - Source Amortization note disclosure contained in the GASB 68 audited schedules for the current measurement period.
 - Enter only the total, by year, of the future amortization of deferred amounts from the notes. To do this, you will have to add future amortization amounts, by year, for each individual category of deferred amount reported in the note.
 - Pay special attention to the fiscal years in which the amounts will be recognized as well as the sign on the amount (debits are positive amounts and credits are negative amounts...they should always be netted for this note.)
 - Important: Amounts in the GASB 68 Schedule's amortization note disclosure are reported in thousands. Therefore, you MUST add three zeros to the end of the totals when keying them into the GASB 68 financial statement template.

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- 22. Fill in yellow highlighted cells of the "Ret Contr Input" tab (must be done for LEAs as well as MCVCs in the case of fiscal agents.
 - Sources:
 - WVEIS expenditure by function report for objects 231 and 233 for FY23 and FY22 (may copy FY22 amounts from prior year template as well)
 - WVEIS expenditure by function report for object 235 for FY23
 - WVEIS revenue by source for codes 03911 and 03917 for FY23
 - Ensure that totals on the WVEIS reports agree to totals in the "totals for conversion entries" section at the bottom of the worksheet.
 - The amount used for revenue source 03911 should only include amounts of the State Aid current subsidy that was allocated to the TRS plan. That amount can be determined by reducing the total of revenue source 03911 by any amounts allocated to the TDC plan.

- 40. Review check totals on the "TrialBal" tab
 - Journal entry check at bottom of tab ensures that debits and credits posted to the conversion entries section of the trial balance are in balance.
 - Uses "SUMIF" formula to total debits and credits for each entry using the journal entry numbers entered into column G of the trial balance.
 - Amounts listed in the "out of balance" column could be due to 2 issues:
 - Incorrect JE numbers entered into column G of the trial balance.
 - Amount posted to the conversion entries section of the trial balance are linked incorrectly from the "JEs" tab or are incomplete.

 - MD&A ROU Assets
 - MD&A Gen Obligation




Financial Statements: Completing the Excel Files

- 44. Complete Encumbrance Distribution tab:
 - Needed in order to see appropriate allocation of encumbrances across all fund balance categories.



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Financial Statements: MD&A Template

- In order to preserve the links between the Word and Excel files, they must have been each downloaded into the same file folder on your network or local drive.
- Only 4 tables within the Excel file link directly to the MD&A.
- Read through each page of the MD&A, providing information for all blanks and items in red font.
- · Pie charts:
 - Please review the pie charts in the Word file against the charts in the Excel file prior to submitting the financial statements to OSF.



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Financial Statements: MD&A Template

- The purpose of the MD&A is to furnish an *objective* and easily readable *analysis* of the county's financial activities.
- It should contain:
 - A discussion of the basic financial statements.
 - · Condensed comparative data.
 - An analysis of the government's overall financial position and results of operations.
 - An analysis of the balances and transactions of individual funds.
 - An analysis of budgetary variations.
 - A description of capital assets and long-term debt activity.
 - A discussion of infrastructure (n/a for the school boards).
 - A discussion of currently known facts, decisions, or conditions of future significance.



- Changes made from the final FY22 template have been highlighted in yellow.
- Some of the amounts reported in the Notes template are using FY22 data because FY23 data remains unavailable at this time.
 - MBC and BTI amounts in Note 1
 - TDC section of retirement note
- If the underlying entities' financial statements have been issued prior to the issuance of the district's financials, these amounts should be updated to FY23 amounts.
- Exception: TRS section of the retirement note and the OPEB note (should continue to report FY22 amounts since the GASB 68 and GASB 75 entries use a measurement date of June 30, 2022.)



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Financial Statements: Note Disclosures

- Note 1.E. Cash & Investments
 - Table is not linked to an underlying Excel template file (key directly into Word table).
 - Delete sections dealing with MBC and BTI if the district does not have balances held by those entities.
- Note 1.F. Fill in total allowance for uncollectible food service accounts, if applicable.
- Note 1.L. Deferred Outflows
 - If amounts are reported in the aggregate on the face of the financial statements, you must detail out the individual balances making up the total.
 - Most counties report in the aggregate.
 - If not, delete the discussion regarding aggregated amounts.



- Note 1.P. Deferred Inflows
 - If amounts are reported in the aggregate on the face of the financial statements, you must detail out the individual balances making up the total.
 - · Most counties report in the aggregate.
 - · If not, delete the discussion regarding aggregated amounts.
- Note 1.V. Newly Adopted GASB Statements
 - Has been updated to discuss GASB Statements that are required to be implemented for FY23.
 - OSF has completed the conclusion on each GASB Statement with the relevant assumptions as to applicability.
 - Please read each GASB Statement within the section and make sure the conclusions are accurate based on the specific situation in your county.



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Financial Statements: Note Disclosures

- Note 6 Tax Abatements:
 - Counties will need to determine whether they have a tax abatement situation and report all pertinent details of the abatement agreement within this disclosure.
- Note 7 Capital Assets
 - Links directly with Excel Template.
 - Multiple functionality with such linking.
- Note 8 Long-Term Debt
 - First table links to Excel file, others do not.
 - Future debt service amounts should be entered from the data in the "long term debt" tab of the Excel template (not linked).
 - Bond issuance information must be entered (Municipal Bond Commission), if applicable.
 - Defeasance of Debt, if applicable.



- Note 9 Leases that Transfer Ownership, Short-Term Leases, and ROU Assets
 - Much of the ROU Asset section is linked to the financial statement template
- Note 10 Employee Retirement System
 - Much of the TRS section is linked to the GASB 68 template.
 - There is a section on the GASB 68 JE's tab on the GASB 68 template that makes it easier to identify certain required portions that are not linked to the GASB 68 template.
 - Plan level TDC information is not available for FY23 but should be updated to FY23 if it becomes available prior to the issuance of the county's audit.


- Note 11 OPEB
 - Much of the OPEB section is linked to the GASB 75 template.
 - There is a section on the GASB 75 JE's tab on the GASB 75 template that makes it easier to identify certain required portions that are not linked to the GASB 75 template.
 - Disclosures are very similar to the GASB 68 disclosures.
- Note 14 Fund Balances
 - · Pulls directly from Excel template.
 - Again, do not include "TBD" as a category.
- Note 15 Commitments, Contingencies, and Subsequent Events
 - Include encumbrances in total, and by fund.
 - Medicaid paragraph of the note has been updated to report the latest information regarding the cost settlement process.



- Notes to RSI & OSI:
 - Update to include budgetary deficits (expenditures exceeding budget) for each fund, by function.
 - Actuarial revisions for TRS and RHBT (RSI only) have been updated with the GASB 68 and 75 audited schedules.
 - A table showing the changes in actuarial assumptions, changes in benefit terms, and changes in size or composition of the population covered by the benefit terms for the years that are available for the 2 OSI schedules required by GASB 68 and GASB 75.



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Financial Statements: Steps to Take When You Don't Balance

- The key lies in the "TrialBal" tab.
 - First Step: check the "total" row of the "Debit" and "Credit" columns for the Fund Basis Statements.
 - This section is populated based off the information you have manually entered into the yellow highlighted cells throughout the template.
 - If these two columns do not equal, you have entered an incorrect amount from WVEIS.
 - Compare these amounts to what you have recorded in WVEIS and make any necessary adjustments to ensure you balance.
 - This must be done before moving to the next step.



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Financial Statements: Steps to Take When You Don't Balance

- Second Step: check the "total" row of the "Debit" and "Credit" columns for the Conversion Entries to make sure they agree.
 - You can also use the "Out of Balance" column on the "Journal Entry Check" table at the bottom of the sheet.
 - This table links to the journal entries above and totals both sides of the entry using the designations in column G (A, B, C, D, U1, etc...).
- You must balance here before moving to the next step.



Financial Statements: Steps to Take When You Don't Balance

- Third Step: Make sure that you have posted all the necessary conversion entries.
 - One way to do this is to look at PY entries and make sure that you are posting all the necessary CY entries. It is easy to forget all the entries that need posted.
 - Several of the issues I found in last year's financial statements were that not all of the conversion entries were being posted.



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Financial Statements: Steps to Take When You Don't Balance

- Fourth Step: Check all manually keyed beginning balances.
 - Make sure the beginning balances on all the tabs below agree to PY audited financial statements.
 - "DW St of Activities" tab
 - "Gov Funds Rev Exp" tab
 - "Capital Assets" tab
 - · "ROU Assets" tab
 - "Long term debt" tab



Financial Statements: Steps to Take When You Don't Balance

- Fifth Step: The Entity-Wide DR and CR amounts should now agree, but if they do not, please check to make sure formulas have not been erased in either column.
 - Formulas for these amounts simply add up the WVEIS balances and the Conversion entry balances.
- Once you have made sure all amounts are included and that all three steps balance, your financial statements should balance.
- If they do not balance, it is because the amounts are not being properly carried over from the trial balance tab to the face of the financial statements.



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Financial Statements: Steps to Take When You Don't Balance

- Sixth Step: Trace the information in the "TrialBal" tab to the rest of the financial statement template to make sure the information is flowing through to the face of the Financial Statements.
 - Fund basis amounts should be traced to the Fund Basis Financial Statements.
 - Conversion Entry amounts should be traced to the "JEs" tab.
 - Entity-Wide amounts should be traced to the Government-Wide Financial Statements.
- If you still don't balance, I am happy to help.



Financial Statements: Key Points in Summary

- Year-end closing entries completed during <u>July and August.</u>
- Report an appropriate amount in "nonspendable" fund balance (should be at least your balance of prepaid expenditures and TDC forfeitures).
- Financial statement templates will be released upon final update of each template.
- USE THE WATCH WINDOW.
- "TBD" is not an appropriate type of fund balance.
- Financial statements submission due dates:
 - LEAs September 28, 2023
 - MCVCs September 15, 2023
