Code of Conduct

- As a representative of your school, county and state, you are expected to be an exemplary citizen.
- Infractions of the code of conduct will result in disciplinary action and a phone call to your parent/guardian.
- Students must obey the code of conduct established by your county school system.
- The dress code for the camp is casual.
- Wear comfortable shoes and bring along a sweater or jacket in case the weather is chilly or the air conditioning is on low
- Students are required to attend all classes, seminars, meals, field trips and special events.
- Students must remain in their dorm rooms between the hours of 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Students are not permitted to fraternize with others not attending camp.
- Cell phones may be carried with the student, however, we ask that they are not used during sessions/classes or during speakers.

Lodging and Meals

- Students must follow the dorm rules at the University of Charleston and abide by the student code of conduct.
- Students will need to bring towels, bedding (twin-size bed sheets or sleeping bags) and all other necessities/toiletries with them. This will be a true college dorm experience.
- Students will need to purchase or bring with them any additional snacks or beverages they may want.
- Rooms at UC are modern and air-conditioned.
- Males and Females will be separated into different areas of the dorms. At no time should males or females be in each other's rooms. There are common areas for socializing.

Other Information

- Transportation for all camp activities in the Charleston area will be on school buses provided by Kanawha County Schools; activities off campus will be provided by charter bus.
