- Two teacher recommendations: one of these recommendations **must** come from a teacher who has worked with you in your arts area. Letters should be submitted on professional letterhead. Please provide sufficient notice to your teachers prior to submitting the application.
- Exhibit a strong commitment to personal artistic development in one of the areas listed below:
 - o Acting
 - Creative Writing
 - o Dance
 - Instrumental Music
 - Studio Art
 - Vocal Music
 - Digital Media
- Submit an audition piece as specified within this application.

- The state deadline for Part I and II of the application and the audition piece is March 1, 2024.
- Part II of the application (this form and all supporting documents as required within the application) are submitted directly to the state file upload folder.
- A copy of transcripts is required with the application. This document will need to be provided by the school counselor.
- On the final page of this application, you will find a checklist of all required pieces. It is your responsibility as the student to scan all components into a PDF and submit the entire application file to the upload folder. We recommend asking a teacher or counselor to review all your information before you submit it.

West Virginia has a rich cultural history, with diverse communities expressing themselves through music, dance, theater, writing, and visual arts. We draw on this cultural heritage to foster community through art at GSA, empowering you to find community with other artists both in and outside of your chosen artistic discipline.

Write an essay (400-500 words) **about your experiences of finding or creating community through art by interacting with different people or engaging diverse audiences.** Highlight a specific example where the arts have helped you find or foster community with people from different walks of life. This could include experiences at school, extracurricular activities, in your hometown, other community spaces, or even digital communities.

Your essay must be completely formatted in a Word document using 12 Times New Roman and double spaced.

The following rubric will be used to evaluate your writing:

Organization and content

- Strong sentence structure
- Content/substance
- points are well organized and well developed;
- includes sufficient details to defend positions;
- uses thoughtful vocabulary;
- uses a variety of sentence types;

Audition Instructions

Students applying for the Governor's School for the Arts are required to submit an audition piece. Each specific discipline has its own requirements.

The audition requirements for each discipline are located below. You may audition for multiple disciplines, but you must include a separate audition piece for each area. You will only be accepted into one discipline for GSA.

- The audition piece(s) are not submitted with the application they are submitted to the upload file location as described on the audition page.

You may want to ask your school counselor to review all your information before you submit the application.

A state selection committee will determine students who participate in GSA.

The West Virginia Department of Education is not accepting paper submissions of applications. Once the student and school counselor have compiled the application and all required documents into one scanned PDF, students may upload the completed application to the file submission. Audition pieces are submitted at a separate file upload as outlined on page 10 of this application.
