### NOTICE OF ADDITIONAL LEVY ELECTION

From the Board of Education of the County of Gilmer to the voters of the County of Gilmer

### TAKE NOTICE.

That at a meeting of the Board of Education of the County of Gilmer, State of West Virginia, held on the 13th day of December 2021 as provided by law, adopted the following levy call and order:

The Board of Education of the County of Gilmer, being of the opinion that the maximum levies for current expenses authorized by Article 8, Chapter 11, of the code of West Virginia, as last amended, will not provide sufficient funds for the payment of current expenses of the Board of Education of the County of Gilmer, including expenditures for purposes hereinafter set forth, during the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2023, July 1, 2024, July 1, 2025, July 1, 2026 and July 1, 2027, and has ascertained that the amounts hereinafter shown in excess of the amounts raised by regular levies will be needed by the Board of Education of the County of Gilmer during each of said five (5) fiscal years, and to include this call for such excess levy on the ballot of the May primary election 2022 per the provisions of Section 16, Article 8, Chapter 11 of the Code, as last amended.

- 1. That the purposes for which additional funds are needed and the annual approximate amount for such purposes after due allowances for exonerations, delinquencies, etc., are including, up to, but not limited to the following:
  - A. To provide funds to repair and maintain all school facilities, to defray some cost for utilities, purchase necessary custodial supplies and equipment, continue existing maintenance contracts on equipment, and to maintain a safe school environment, for an approximate annual cost of \$215,546.

To include funding for supplies, supplemental text books, workbooks, fine arts, media and S.T.E.A.M (Science Technology Engineering Art and Mathematics) operations, to defray vocational and extended curriculum costs and to establish and restore supplements to county support organizations for an approximate annual cost of \$233,000.

To include provision for supplements and transportation for extracurricular secondary school programs, academic extracurricular programs, after school tutoring, alternative learning center, extended year band program, elementary and secondary sports programs, defray cost of monies for substitutes inclusive of professional and service personnel for an approximate annual cost of \$301,000.

- 2. That should any additional monies result from the levy or are available in excess of the actual cost of the aforementioned areas in Sections A, B, and C, those monies are to be applied to the provision of student instructional supplies, materials, equipment, facility improvements and/or capital projects.
- 3. That the approximate amounts needed annually for said purposes is \$ 749.546 after due allowances for exenerations, delinquencies, etc, and the total approximate amount needed during the term of the five (5) year levy is \$ 3,747,730.
- 4. That the separate and aggregate assessed valuation of each class of taxable property within the Gilmer County School District is as follows:

5. That the proposed additional rate of levy in cents on each class of property is as follows:

Provided, however, that the Gilmer County Board of Education reserves the right and authority to -reduce the rates of levy during the terms of this levy if increased assessments produce funds beyond the amounts projected as needed.

- 6. That the proposed years to which the additional levy shall apply are the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2023, July 1, 2024, July 1, 2025, July 1, 2026 and July 1, 2027.
- 7. That the question of such additional levy shall be submitted to a vote at the Primary election to be held on the 8th day of May, 2022.
- 8. That if the levy proposed herein be approved as required by the, the Board of Education of the County of Gilmer will not issue bonds as authorized by Section 16, Article 8, Chapter 11 of the Code of West Virginia as last amended.

- 9. That notice calling such election shall be given by the publication of this order one a week for two successive weeks before said election in two licensed newspapers of opposite politics and of general circulation in the territory in which the election is held and all the provisions of the election laws concerning general election shall apply insofar as they may be applicable.
- 10. That the Gilmer County Board of Education as provided for by Article 8, Chapter 11, of the Code of West Virginia, as last amended, reserves unto itself as the levying body to reduce the rate of the excess levy should increased assessments produce funds beyond projected needs in any year specified in the levy call in accordance with section six-g, article eight, chapter eleven of the West Virginia Code.
- 11. In the event the Board of Education of the County of Gilmer shall obtain additional money, by grant or otherwise, from the state or federal government, or from any agency of either, or from any other source, for the purposes aforesaid, such additional money may be used either in substitution for, or in addition to, the sums obtained from such additional levies as said The Board of Education of the County of Gilmer may from time to time determine.
- 12. The official ballot to be used in the election herein provided shall be in the form as follows.

The Board of Education of the County of Gilmer is hereby authorized, empowered and obligated to expend, during the term of this levy, the surplus, if any, accruing in excess of the above amounts needed for any of the above-state purposes, plus excess collections due to increased assessed valuations for the provision of student instructional supplies, materials, equipment and facility improvements on a per school/per student basis, to be allocated at the end of each fiscal year.

The Board of Education of the County of Gilmer reserves unto itself as the levying body the right and authority to reduce the rates of the excess levy, should increased assessments produce funds beyond projected needs in any year specified in the levy call in accordance with section six-g, article eight, chapter eleven of the West Virginia Code.

In the event the Board of Education of the County of Gilmer shall obtain additional money, by grant or otherwise, from the state or federal government, or from any agency of either, or from any other source, for the purposes aforesaid, such additional money may be used either in substitution for, or in addition to, the sums obtained from such additional levies as said The Board of Education of the County of Gilmer may from time to time determine.

The additional levies, per each one hundred dollars in value, shall be on Class I property 7.84 cents, on Class II property 15.68 cents, on Class III property 31.36 cents and on Class IV property 31.36 cents.
