DESCRIPTION FOR FUNDS

FUND 0303 - SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAM

Personnel Services &

Benefits

Funds provide for salaries and benefits including FICA matching, PEIA,

workers' compensation and teachers' retirement matching.

Current Expenses WVC §18-5D. These funds provide for a match of approximately \$262

million federal child nutrition funds to assist county boards in the administration and operation of the school lunch and breakfast

programs. On average, each school day over 132,000 students are served breakfast, more than 164,000 students are served lunch and over 5,200

are served after-school hours snacks.

FUND 0313 - STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

Other Allowances Under the Public School Support Program:

Teachers Retirement Savings Realized WVC §18-7A-39. Requires any savings realized from the reduction in employer contributions that would have been required in the Teachers' Defined Contribution System to be deposited in the Employee Pension

and Health Care Benefits Fund.

Increased Enrollment

WVC §18-9A-15. Distributed to county boards of education which are projected to have increased enrollment over the current year. The funding requested is based on projected enrollments for the 2023-24 school year. The amount of funding actually distributed to each district will be equal to the district's actual increase in net enrollment over the current year multiplied by the district's average net state aid per pupil.

Alternative Education

WVC §18-9A-21. Distributed to county boards of education for the development and operation of alternative education programs. The allowance equates to \$18 per student based on net enrollment.

Attendance Incentive

Bonus

A \$500 bonus distributed to county boards of education for teachers

using four or less personal/sick days during the year.

Hope Scholarship

WVC §18-9A-25. To provide funding and to accumulate funding for transfer to Hope Scholarship Board to meet the obligations of Hope Scholarship

applications.

Safe Schools Fund (new)

WVC §18-5-48. Distributed to county boards of education and multicounty vocational centers based upon their requests. Funding shall provide for safety needs as identified by the boards/multicounty centers or for special education video cameras.

Sustained Growth

WVC §18-9A-10. An allowance provided under the PSSP to help offset the budgetary impact of extraordinary and sustained increases in net enrollment in a county board of education. County boards are considered to have a sustained growth in enrollment if their most recent three-year average growth in net enrollment is two percent or more.

Allowance for County Transfers WVC §18-9A-14. Distributed to county boards of education that transfer students to another school district pursuant to an agreement approved by the West Virginia Board of Education as an allowance for facility efficiency. The allowance in the year in which the transfer occurs is to be 100% of the amount in the agreement, not to exceed the district's per pupil state aid allocation; the allowance in the first year after the transfer is to be 50% of the amount in the agreement; and the allowance for the second year after the transfer is to be 25%. For the 2023-24 year, no funds were requested as there are no active transfer agreements.

English as a Second Language

Distributed to county boards of education to support required services

for

English learner students.

Other Funds Distributed to LEAs:

National Teacher WVC §18A-4-2a. Reimbursement of expenses for classroom teachers with Certification National Board Certification.

Early Childhood Drug Prevention Education Support and collaboration with districts, schools, communities and families to address the physical, social-emotional, behavioral, and mental health needs of students.

Technology Repair and Modernization

To provide timely and appropriate support, repair and telecommunications assistance for district level systems and software.

Early Retirement Notification Incentive WVC §18A-2-5a. A \$500 bonus distributed to county boards of education for classroom teachers who provide early notification of retirement by March 1st.

Math Program

The mathematics program is designed to provide mathematics specific professional development, to create instructional resources and to develop teacher leadership at the local level.

21st Century Fellows

Program that allows pre-k through 12 employees to work with universities on educational programs while allowing them to maintain retirement benefits.

Teacher Reimbursement

WVC §18A-3-3a. Distributed to county boards of education to reimburse teachers on continuing contracts for courses taken to renew certification or individuals working on an additional endorsement in a shortage area.

High-Y Youth in Government

Funding used to support the Hi-Y Youth in Government program.

High Acuity Special Needs

Funding appropriated under WVC §18-20-5 that is available to counties via

an application reimbursement process to assist with the costs of serving students with high acuity special education needs whose expenditures meet or exceed the expenditure criteria established under the High Cost/High Acuity Reimbursement Plan.

IT Academy Subsequently renamed Microsoft Imagine Academy. Funds are used to

purchase statewide licenses for use by school districts for curriculum

and for CTE student certification.

Early Literacy Program Formula funded to target factors associated with increasing 3rd grade

literacy proficiency utilizing targeted classroom instructional resources and support, school readiness efforts, summer and/or extended day learning

opportunities, etc.

School-Based Truancy

Prevention

Provides shared costs for truancy specialists at the county level in 34 counties. In order to provide judges options for truant students and reduce the number of children placed outside their home, the West Virginia Schools of Diversion and Transition Programs is supporting quality, full-day educational services at three Youth Reporting Centers (YRCs) and eight county school systems in collaboration with the LEA and

Bureau of Iuvenile Service (BIS) in a number of counties.

Communities In Schools Communities In Schools (CIS) works in partnership with the school

system to develop community partnerships that bring resources into the schools and help remove barriers to student learning. CIS pays attention to the physical, social, psychological and academic needs of individual students which are critical components in reducing dropouts and

increasing graduation rates.

Mastery Based Education An education system designed to improve educational outcomes by

advancing student mastery of content knowledge and skills.

21st Century Technology Infrastructure Network

Tools & Support

Provides for K-12 classroom computers, servers, cabling, software, staff development, Internet access, computers for libraries and bandwidth. Also provides funding for Virtual Schools, WVEIS and online Spanish

courses.

Additional funding is provided in the Lottery Fund.

Educational Program

Allowance

Funds distributed to Pickens School in Randolph County, Paw Paw School in Morgan County, Aurora School in Preston County, and Meadow Bridge School in Fayette County, and for Project Based Learning in STEM fields in

Pendleton County.

Department Operations:

Personnel Services & Benefits

Funds provide for salaries and benefits including FICA matching, PEIA, workers' compensation and teachers' retirement matching.

Unclassified Programs funded through the unclassified, current, repairs, buildings,

land and other assets include: professional development, principals/ teachers institutes and recognition, takeover county superintendent supplementals, Golden Horseshoe, Social Studies Fair and School Board

Effectiveness.

Advanced Placement Provides opportunities for willing and academically prepared students to

pursue college-level coursework while still in high school.

Current expense budgets (rent, phone, travel, etc.) **Current Expenses** WVC §18-9E-4. To provide assistance to local boards of education in **HVAC** Technicians servicing, troubleshooting and repairing heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems in public schools throughout West Virginia. Assessment Programs Supplement to the assessment program that had been previously funded with Lottery funds. Program provides shared governance between K-12 schools and Benedum Professional institutions of higher learning. Development Collaborative Governor's Honors An academy that operates summer programs designed to honor high-Academy ability/high-achieving students. Hospitality Training Funds are distributed to county boards of education and other vendors to provide professional development for students and teachers, state and national competitions and student credentials. Funds are used to prepare students for careers in the management, marketing and operations of restaurants and other food services, lodging, attractions, recreational events and travel-related services, as well as to provide training certifications to industry in food safety and guest services. Foreign Student Education An international school to provide continuing instruction in Japanese for students who accompany their parents to West Virginia for employment. West Virginia Board of Funding for personnel and office expenses. **Education Administrative** Costs Mountain State Digital WVC §18-2E-12. Provides funding to support a pilot project in grades K-8. The intent of the project shall be to provide resources to both students Literacy and faculty to teach digital literacy, online assessment preparation, and internet safety. 21st Century Learners Various 21st Century Learning programs such as County School System Leadership Academy, School Improvement Conference and Content Standards Training. BRIM Premium Board of Risk and Insurance Management Premium. 21st Century Assessment Development of rigorous assessment items which address 21st Century and Professional content, technology and professional development. Development Special Olympic Games Funds assist with five state-level events.

FUND 0314 - AID FOR EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN & INSTITUTIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Special Education-Counties WVC §18-20. Funds are distributed to county boards of education to pay costs of county special education programs in grades K-12 and for preschool programs for children with disabilities. Funds are also distributed to counties that must provide instruction for out-of-county students and out-of-state placement of exceptional children.

Special Education-Institutions

WVC §§18-20 and 18-2-13h. Funds are used for state special education administration, education of children in state health and human service facilities and special projects.

Detention Centers

Education of Juveniles Held WVC §§18A-4-17 and 49-5E-6. The West Virginia Board of Education and in Predispositional Juvenile the Department of Education are responsible for the educational services in the state's nine juvenile centers. Both predispositional and committed students are served in the facilities. A total of 957 students received educational services in these facilities during FY 2022.

Education of Institutionalized Juveniles and Adults

WVC §§18-2-13f, 18-2-13h and 18-20-5. The West Virginia Board of Education and the State Superintendent of Schools are responsible for the administration of educational programs for institutionalized juveniles and adults in state correctional institutions and regional jails. The department provides direct educational services in 45 institutions. The department offers a constitutionally required education program for school-aged juveniles and provides the educational services for adults required by the State Supreme Court. In its education programs for institutionalized individuals, the department served 7,328 juveniles and adults during the last school year.

FUND 0317 - STATE AID TO SCHOOLS

Step 1 - Professional Educators

WVC §18-9A-4. Allowance for the basic salaries and state supplement for professional educators employed by county boards of education. The allowance for FY 2024 is based on 18,375 professional educators, which is a decrease from FY 2023 of 70 professional educators.

Step 2 - Service Personnel

WVC §18-9A-5. Allowance for the basic salaries and state supplement for service personnel employed by county boards of education. The allowance for FY 2024 is based on 11,290 service personnel, which is a decrease from FY 2023 of 44 service personnel.

Step 3 - Fixed Charges

WVC §18-9A-6. Allowance for employee benefits for professional educators and service personnel: FICA 7.65%, unemployment .04% and workers' compensation .57% for a total of 8.26%.

Step 4 -Transportation

WVC §18-9A-7. Allowance for the student transportation operating costs and replacement of the school bus fleet over a 12-year cycle. Districts are divided into the following four groups, based on student population density, with the allowance for operating costs based on the percentage of actual expenditures indicated: Sparse - 95%, Low - 92.5%, Medium - 90%, and High - 87.5%. Additional allowances of 10% are provided for districts that use alternative fuel or transport students to and from the multi-county vocational centers, based on mileage percentages. Districts also receive additional allowances of 5% for the portion of their school bus system that is manufactured within the state of West Virginia. Allowances also provided for insurance costs at 100% of insurance premiums and for payments paid in lieu of transportation at a state average rate. An allowance is also provided to county boards with increased enrollments to purchase additional buses if other eligibility criteria are met.

Step 5 - Professional Student Support Personnel

WVC §18-9A-8. Allowance to pay the annual state minimum salary and state supplement for professional student support personnel employed, limited to five professional student support personnel per each 1,000 students in net enrollment. The allowance for FY 2024 is based on 1,268 professional student support personnel positions, which is a decrease from FY 2023 of 5 positions.

Step 6 - Other Current Expenses

WVC §18-9A-9. Allowance for other current expenses such as utilities and facilities maintenance, substitute costs and faculty senates. Allowance for current expenses is based on the statewide average actual operations and maintenance expenditures, the square footage of school buildings, and student enrollment; allowance for substitutes is 2.5% of Steps 1, 2 and 5 and the allowance for faculty senates is \$400 per professional instructional personnel and professional student support personnel employed.

Step 7a - Improved Instructional Programs WVC §18-9A-10 (a)(1). Allowance for each school district for the improvement of instructional programs. The allowance for instructional improvements is the prior year appropriation plus 10% of the growth in local share.

Step 7b - 21st Century Strategic Technology Learning Growth WVC §18-9A-10 (a)(2). Allowance for the improvement of instructional technology. The amount appropriated each year is the amount appropriated for the preceding year plus 20% of the growth in local share.

Step 7c - Advanced Placement®

WVC §18-9A-10 (a)(3). Allowance for students enrolled in Advance Placement®, dual credit, and international baccalaureate courses, based on 1% of the state average per pupil state aid multiplied by the number of students enrolled in such courses in each district.

Induction

Step 7d - Teacher & Leader WVC §18-9A-10 (a)(4). Allowance for comprehensive systems for teacher and leader induction and professional growth. The amount appropriated is the amount appropriated for the preceding year plus 20% of the growth in local share.

Basic Foundation Allowance

WVC §18-9A-3. Allowance is the sum of the above seven allowances. The basic program allowance includes both the state's share and the local districts' share.

Less Local Share

WVC §18-9A-11. Estimated 85% of the regular levy tax collections, based on the estimated assessed values provided by the State Tax Commissioner. The final local share amount will be updated with actual values from the Certificates of Valuation provided by the county assessors on March 3, 2023.

Adjustments - Taxes Not Collected

WVC §18-9A-12. Provides that the allocated state aid share for a county shall be increased by amounts certified by the State Tax Commissioner for taxes not collected due to final court orders or final decisions by a board of assessment appeals.

Adjustments - Payments in Lieu of Taxes

WVC §18-9A-12. Provides that the allocated state aid share for a county shall be decreased by contributions or payments in lieu of taxes, as certified by the State Tax Commissioner.

Public Employees' Insurance Agency

WVC §18-9A-24. Allowance for the employers' share of insurance premium costs. The average rate for computing the FY 2024 allowance was \$7,220. The amount of funding requested for FY 2024 was reduced by \$699,399 to utilize amounts already on deposit with PEIA.

Teachers' Retirement System

WVC §§18-9A-6a, 18-9A-6b. Allowance for the teachers' retirement system.

School Construction Fund

WVC §18-9A-10. Amount to meet the annual debt service requirements on bonds issued by the School Building Authority prior to January 1, 1994. Because all of the debt service requirements have been met, statute requires \$24 million to be deposited into the school construction fund annually.

Retirement Systems-**Unfunded Liability**

WVC §18-9A-6a. Provides that there be an allowance for the reduction of the unfunded liability of the teachers' retirement fund. The allowance is based on an actuarial report of the amount of funding necessary to eliminate the unfunded liability over a forty-year period beginning July 1, 1994.

Vocational Aid Funds are provided to local educational agencies for the operation of programs that serve more than 160,000 students in secondary, advanced career and public service programs. Funds also provide for technical assessments, student credentials, professional development, youth activities and Southern Regional Education Board activities.

> Provides adults, 16 years of age and older, who are not enrolled in a public school, with work readiness skills and basic academic skill development in reading, math, computer literacy, science, social studies and language arts. It also provides instruction for the high school equivalency test and English as a second language. Approximately 10,000 adults are served each year.

West Virginia's comprehensive response to the substance use disorder crisis which eliminates barriers to employment and provides support through training and career certifications at local adult and career training centers as well as community and technical colleges.

This program provides funds, through a competitive grant process, to local educational agencies for the purchase of instructional equipment to modernize occupational programs in career and technical education.

Funds are used to operate the state high school equivalency testing program and for supervision of all official testing centers in West Virginia. Approximately 4,250 adults and K-12 students are tested yearly with a passage rate of 83%.

Funds are provided through grants to local education agencies to assist agricultural education students with their expenses while representing West Virginia in National FFA Career Development Events.
