SY22 Discipline: The Totals

- Total Incidents: 169,963 • 51,432 students referred
- Suspensions: 66,904
 28,702 students suspended
- Instructional Days Lost: 177,777.75
 Average: 6.19 days per student suspended







% of Students Referred & Suspended by Race/Ethnicity






% of Students Referred & Suspended by Socioeconomic Status



■ All Students ■ Low SES ■ Not Low SES




% of Students Referred & Suspended by Foster Care Status



All Students Foster Care Not Foster




% of Students Referred & Suspended by Homeless Status



All Students Homeless Not Homeless




% of Students Referred & Suspended by Disability Status




Representation by Race/Ethnicity






Representation by Race/Ethnicity






Representation by Socioeconomic Status






Representation by Foster Care Status






Representation by Homeless Status








































Average Instructional Days Lost to Suspension (ISS & OSS)






Average Instructional Days Lost to In-School Suspension (ISS)

Focus: Black or African American Children

- 4% of all students

 7% of students referred
 About 1 of every 3 students were referred (31%)
- 64% of referred Black students were suspended
 About 1 in 5 Black students were suspended
 8% of all students suspended were Black
- 15% of all students referred for more than 10 incidents
- 16% of all students suspended more than 10 days



Focus: Black or African American Children

- Lost 8.8 instructional days to suspension
 Almost 3 more days than White peers
 - 2.2 to 3.5 more days than peers of other races or ethnicities
- At Levels 2 and 3, suspensions slightly more likely to be out-of-school compared to White peers
 - 60% of Level 2 suspensions were OSS, compared to 57% for White peers
 - 76% of Level 3 were OSS, compared to 69%



Focus: Economically Disadvantaged Children

- 53% of all students, and ...
 63% of all students referred
 68% of all students suspended
 71% of all students suspended out of school
- 23% of all low SES students were referred
 14% of all low SES students were suspended
- 73% of all suspensions
- Lost 6.9 instructional days to suspension
- 85% of all students suspended more than 10 days



Focus: Economically Disadvantaged Children

- Discrepancies more pronounced for Black students

 34% of Black low SES students were referred
 65% of Black low SES students referred for discipline were suspended
 22% of these students were suspended in total
 On average lost 9.25 instructional days to suspension (about 2.5 more days than non-low
 - SES Black peers and White low SES peers)



Focus: Students with Disabilities

- 19% of all students, and . . .
 - 23% of all students referred
 - $_{\circ}$ 27% of all students suspended
 - 30% of all students suspended out of school
 - $_{\rm o}$ 32% of all students suspended more than 10 days
- 23% of all students with disabilities were referred
 15% of all students with disabilities were suspended
 65% of referred SWD were suspended
- Lost 7 instructional days to suspension
- Suspensions slightly more likely to be out-ofschool than in-school (52% compared to 48%)



Focus: Students with Disabilities

- Discrepancies more pronounced for Black students

 37% of Black SWD were referred
 73% of Black SWD referred were suspended
 27% of these students were suspended in total
 On average lost 9.8 instructional days to

 suspension (about 1.6 more days than non-SWD
 Black peers and 3.2 more days than White SWD
- Multi-Racial SWD also raise some concerns



Special Focus: Foster Care Children

- 1.6% of all students, 2.8% of students referred
- 1 of every 3 were referred (34%)
- 73% of referred students were suspended
 About ¼ of all foster students were suspended
- Lost 9.23 instructional days to suspension
 About 3 more days than non-foster peers
- Suspensions more likely to be out-of-school
 55% of suspensions for foster students were OSS (compared to 48% for non-foster peers)



Special Focus: Foster Care Children


- Discrepancies particularly noticeable for minority foster care students
 - 85% of Black foster care students referred for discipline were suspended
 - $_{\circ}$ 37% of these students were suspended in total
 - On average lost 14.7 instructional days to suspension (about 6 more days than non-foster Black peers and White foster care peers)
- **Caution:** Student counts are relatively small for this subgroup




Chronic Absenteeism by Number of Suspensions






Chronic Absenteeism by Total Days of Suspension






ELA Proficiency Rate by Number of Suspensions






ELA Proficiency Rate by Total Days of Suspension
