West Virginia Seal of Biliteracy



The Seal of Biliteracy is a nationally recognized award presented to high school students who demonstrate proficiency in English and at least one other language. Some of the benefits of receiving the Seal of Biliteracy are:

- · Multiple universities recognize the Seal of Biliteracy and award college credit to students.
- The study of languages prepares students with 21st Century skills that increase employability, give economic opportunities, and enrich their lives within a global society.
- The recognition of the Seal of Biliteracy provides employers with a method of identifying people with bilingual skills.
- The study of languages creates individuals with a positive disposition toward others.
- The seal validates a specific linguistic skill level.

Students may demonstrate their command of the language through various proficiency tests. Acceptable tests and scores are listed below. Other evidence may be accepted on a case-by-case basis.

Middle school or high school students may apply for the Seal, with recognition given at high school graduation. The fees for the assessments range from \$0 to \$140 and are the responsibility of the student, school, or school system. The West Virginia Seal of Biliteracy was implemented during the 2020-2021 academic year. As of 2024, all 50 states have a Seal of Biliteracy for recognizing student language skills.
