Wood County Schools has submitted a request for a waiver of Policy 4336, West Virginia School Bus Transportation Regulations, Procedures, and Specifications for the Design and Equipment of School Buses, sections 2.13.g (floor shall not be black) and 1.31.a (3000 Pupil Transport Series, 77 to 90 passenger). The buses requiring the waivers have black floors, are 2500 Pupil Transport Series, 77 to 90 passengers, and are currently available for purchase.

It is recommended that **Wood County Schools' request for a waiver of Policy 4336, sections 2.13.g (black floors) and 1.31.a**

(2500 Pupil Transport Series, 77 to 90 passengers), be approved.

2. **Statewide Waiver of Policy 5202, Minimum Requirements for the Licensure of Professional/Paraprofessional Personnel and Advanced Salary Classifications, Section 11.9.d - (Action)** Attachment C

The Grow Your Own (GYO) West Virginia Teaching Pathway was initially implemented during the 2021-22 school year. Students who were participants in the GYO West Virginia program from the initial implementation have now graduated high school with experiences in classrooms, college credits towards a Bachelor of Education Degree, and in some cases an associate degree. As these students with associate degrees continue to pursue their Bachelor of Education Degree, they have obtained sufficient knowledge and skill to be able to substitute in elementary and middle schools. The current policy indicates that Restricted Short-Term Substitute Permit “has attained the age of 21” which these students have not.

It is requested that **GYO West Virginia participants that have graduated high school, are 18 years of age, have successfully completed an associate degree or 60 college credit hours, and are currently enrolled in a WVBE-approved educator preparation program leading to licensure be permitted to substitute in elementary and middle school classrooms until such time as Policy 5202 is amended.**

3. **Employment of Substitute Teachers in Areas of Critical Need and Shortage - (Action)** Attachment D

Policy 6200 requires all local boards of education to submit amendments to CEFPs to the WVBE and the School Building Authority of West Virginia (SBA) for approval. The Monroe County Board of Education requests approval to revise their 2020-2030 CEFP to include renovations and the construction of additional classrooms at James Monroe Technical Center. The project will enhance the school's educational offerings and is proposed to be funded through local funds and a grant from the SBA.
